Make it Too Big To Rig

While Mail-In Voting is not ideal, at the moment, it is available. Pennsylvania enacted mail-in voting in 2019 with Act 77 and it survived a court challenge in 2020.

We will see what happens with the Supreme Court case and the SAVE America Act, but for the time being, it remains in place and that puts Republican Candidates at a disadvantage. In the 2025 election, Bucks County Democrats had a 4 to 1 lead in mail-in ballots going into Election Day.

By contrast, the 2024 election only had Democrats up by .4 - less than ONE mail-in ballot going into Election Day.

We need to move momentum back in line with 2024 and take back some of the ground Democrats gained a year ago. If you are an I-vote-in-every-election voter, we still need you to vote on Election Day.

But we also need you to encourage your friends and neighbors that only vote once every four years to fill out the Mail-In Application. Or the busy parent



that may not be able to make it to the polls on Election Day. Or the 18-22 year old college student that may not be in town on Election Day. The Mail-In Application filled out today will cover both the Primary Election in May AND the General Election in November. Let's get out the vote!

May 19 brings a new Primary Election

If you have previously voted by mail, you should have received a letter from the Board of Elections & Registration Commission. In order to continue voting by mail, this enclosed application needs to be filled out and returned EVERY YEAR. This will allow you to vote by mail in BOTH the May and November elections. You will not have to fill out a new application for the November election. Mail in ballots are not ideal. But right now they are available in PA. If you are someone that may not get to the polls on Election Day, or maybe volunteering to man the polls or get out the vote on Election Day,

New Hope- Solebury Property Taxes

NEW HOPE-SOLEBURY SCHOOL DISTRICT

If you own a home in New Hope Boro or Solebury Township, your property taxes are roughly one-third to the Boro/Township and County and two-thirds to the School District.

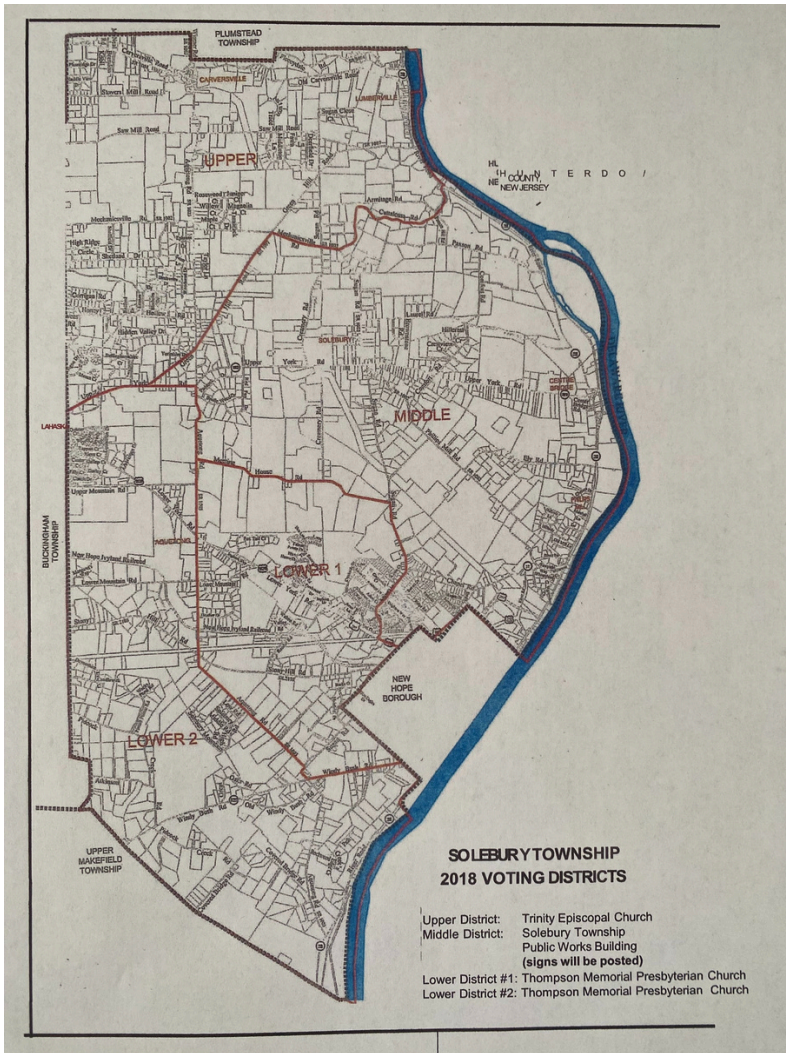
Taxes for the Boro/Township and County are typically due April 1 and School District taxes are typically due August 1.

In 2026, Solebury Township and New Hope Boro did not increase taxes and the County had a modest tax increase of 1.3%. The School District is right now debating an increase of 6.19%, which is 2.69% above the Act One Index of 3.5%. This will mean an increase of \$400 per household, on average, with higher-value homes seeing a larger dollar increase; lower-value homes seeing less.
