A 1971 GRADUATE OF Point Pleasant High School, Larry Williams has gone from high school leader to community leader. During his high school career, Larry was the freshman class president, vice president of the Key Club in both his junior and senior years, and was also president of the Student Council. He was a four-year participant in football and baseball, earning six varsity letters in those two sports. He received honorable mention as a pitcher on the All-County baseball team after pitching only the second no-hitter in Point Pleasant High School history in 1971. During his senior year, Larry was selected as an Asbury Park Press Teen-Ager of the Week.

Larry began his life as a community leader in 1972 when he joined the Point Pleasant Borough Fire Company #2. He served in a number of capacities, rising to the rank of captain. He also served as a trustee and was selected "Fireman of the Year" in 1975.

In 1976, Larry was appointed to the Point Pleasant Police Department, first as a special officer and later as a regular police officer. He is presently a Sergeant and is assigned to the patrol division. He was selected as the 1990-1991 "Policeman of the Year" by Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post 4715.

In 1988, Larry was first elected to the Point Pleasant Board of Education where he served until 1991. He returned to the Board of Education in 1994 and is presently the president. He also served as vice-president in 1995 and as president in 1996.

Larry has been a Little League baseball and softball coach as well as a recreation league soccer coach. He has been married to his wife Debbie for 24 years and they have 3 children, Kelly, a junior at Green Mountain College in Vermont, Courtney, a freshman at Flagler College in Florida, and Kevin a freshman at Point Pleasant High School.
