For the past twenty years, Rich has been actively involved in the community by donating to local charities and benefits, as well as to town school functions. He has sponsored numerous sports leagues in both Point Pleasant and Brick.

Rich has participated in the New Jersey State Ice Cream Festival in Toms River. This annual festival always has a huge turnout, where ice cream stores from New Jersey bring one homemade ice cream flavor to be judged. Rich has won first place for Best Flavor and People's Choice for the past nine out of ten years - Vanilla Peanut Butter Crunch, Ooey Gooey Oreo and Peanut Butter Overload, to name a few.

The business has continued to grow; in addition to the Point Pleasant location, Rich added two more stores in South Toms River (2001) and Manasquan (2005). This expansion gave him some much needed space that allows him to make all ice cream products in Toms River and deliver to the other stores.

Rich lives in Brick with his wife, Kathleen, and their three children, Michael, 10; Matthew, 8; and Gabrielle, 4. He has coached both of his sons' baseball teams for the past four years and participated with their football team. He is a member of the board of Brick Little League and has recently become a member of the Knights of Columbus.
