

Dearborn County CASA started this concept 14 years ago where our Youth Ambassadors present workshops or as we like to call them LEARNSHOPS to eight grade students. The learnshops are 40 minutes each and there are five of them for attendees to experience throughout the day As well as several educational stations. Topics included are: Alcohol, Drugs, Vaping, Descion making and others that vary with the teen social climate. We build the framework for this knowing that smaller peer to peer activities encourage the best memory retention in relation to these topics based on assessments we've collected over the past six years at previous summits. Each learnshop also hinges on a physical or mental challenge that makes them "hands on". Offering hands-on activities benefits all types of learners by providing opportunities for all types of learners to observe as well as perform. Hands-on training can expose students to challenges and obstacles they may encounter and gives them an opportunity to practice their problem-solving skills. Since the learnshops are run by other teens and not adults- students tend to feel more comfortable and participate more freely. The smaller groups also prevent the "By-Stander effect" that you get with allot of large-scale auditorium convocations.


Our Youth Ambassadors program is unique in the southeastern Indiana area and throughout the years, we have had 7 named "Student Volunteer of the Year" and 3 named "Runners Up" by the Prevention FIRST of Greater Cincinnati. They consist of youth from all over the county and represent all three public school districts as well as home schoolers and private schools. There are currently 29 of them from across the county who give freely of their time and energy —outside of school and other responsibilities- that is true community service! Everything that the ambassadors do they do in the name of substance abuse prevention. Innovative peer leadership models can bring

about a solution in schools and communities where false beliefs about use can put students at risk. Virtually every member of a community has a vital role to play in keeping kids safe and drug-free.
