

RULES OF PLAY FOR SHOOTOUT

- 1a The game is played with a golf putter and golf balls
- 1b The game is played on a lawn bowls green
- 1c The game can be played by up to 10 players individually in one lane, each player should have a ball of a different colour or markings so as to be able to identify from each other
- 1d Participants play in a particular order, drawn by lot and recorded, player who goes first in round one will go last in round two if they are not eliminated
- 2a Once one end has been played the next end commences in the opposite direction
- 2b The first player to start each end can choose the position to putt from, each subsequent player must play from that same length but can move laterally to either side of the marked lane
- 2c The first player determines where to play from and rolls out the jack by hand to any length, the jack is then centred in the playing lane
- 2d The defined playing area is the marked lines or boundaries of the lane up to the gutter and including to a point at least halfway to the distance of the jack. A players ball may finish outside the marked playing area but still be in play, the gutter however is Out of Bounds and more than one player can be eliminated at each end.
- 3a The player whose ball finishes the furthest from the jack is eliminated from the game.
- 3b Only the player whose ball is furthest from the jack needs to mark the position of that ball with one of the chip markers provided. All balls must be lifted from the rink so the following players have a clear putt to the jack.
- 3c At each end one player will be eliminated in the shootout who is the furthest from the jack, any player or player's that putts into the gutter or whose ball does not reach at least halfway to the jack shall be eliminated.
- 4a The winner of the game is the last man standing and is declared the Shootout Champion
