+ .1. Identify the 3 subscales with the lowest scores


- 2. Within the domain, identify the specific problems needing the most immediate attention

Developing Community Resources

- Network, network, network!
 Add new resources to the data base as you find them
- Attend community events pass out cards.
- Get to know churches, temples
 and mosques
- Note; Never make a referral to an NGO until you check them out – licensure, oversight, fees, hidden costs, reputation in the community.





Implementing the Plan

- Consent or Buy-in?
- Match referral to family
 Identify and overcome barriers to service
- Empowerment with encouragement and direction
- Show respect for family preferences and values





Tips for a Great IAT Meeting

- Start on time
- Model appropriate behavior
- Stay on task, but allow time for discussion
- Give follow up on previous cases, successes as well as failures.
- Build consensus on IIP.
- Honor other agencies boundariesShow respect for all professions
