I had heard the name of Martin Luther King and the association of King with the Indian freedom fighter, Mahatma Gandhi, who spoke about civil disobedience and rights of the socially outcasts, known Harijans, in India. Upon my arrival in this country, I understood the significance of this linkage. King Jr. was inspired by the writings of Gandhi which I also learned more deeply later. For a young person, these names were of some leaders mentioned in academics due to their uplifting socially unifying message to the society.

I learned King's famous words, "I have a dream" and the importance after reading his speech and listening on television broadcasts on his birthday. It is then I truly understood not only the name, but the importance of the message. Now, these words reverberate in my ears.



Now is the time to make real the promise of democracy.

Now it the time to rise from the dark and desolate valley of segregation to the sunlit path of racial justice.

Now it the time to lift our nation from the quicksand of racial injustice to the solid rock of brotherhood.

Now is the time to make justice a reality to all of God's children.

History has recorded the importance of King's message - On August 28, 1963, some 100 years after President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation freeing the slaves, a young man named Martin Luther King climbed the marble steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C. to describe his vision of America. More than 200,000 peopleblack and white-came to listen. They came by plane, by car, by bus, by train, and by foot. They came to Washington to °° °° °°



demand equal rights for black people. And the dream that they heard on the steps of the Monument became the dream of a generation. His courage and determination and desire to achieve racial justice is commendable. It was the determination of King to explain to the masses the message of the American Constitution, a promise that all men are guaranteed the inalienable right of life - lived in liberty and in the pursuit of his or her happiness.

Born in 1929, Martin Luther King's actual birthday is January 15, it is now celebrated on third Monday of January every year. His birthday is celebrated throughout in all states of America. The campaign to accept this day as a federal holiday in King's honor began soon after his assassination in 1968. President Ronald Reagan signed the holiday into law in 1983, however, President Bill Clinton, on August 23, 1994, made this holiday as a federal holiday, a holiday that is set under the Uniform Monday Holiday Act. The earliest Monday for this holiday is January 15 and the latest is January 21. Martin Luther King and his legendary legacy lives on.

His goals for 2022, serving as vice president are: To support NFIA goals, support efforts for fund raising and finally, to work as a team player and support goals established by the NFIA President.




He intends to help NFIA in getting the NFIA message out to the public by providing good public relations service. He is committed to serving and fulfilling his assigned tasks efficiently.



Major Gurjit Singh (who joined Indian Army in 1974 in Corps of Engineers and served 21 years), Colonel Navan Krishnan (a great hockey player and civil engineer commissioned Corps of Engineers, had various stints in different positions),

and Captain Aparna Hande (who served in Indian Army from 1965-1971 at Rajouri Border in Kashmir) were on hand to tell the stories of their experiences during their time in the Indian Army. Major Gurjit Singh told the story how, Indira Gandhi, then Prime Minister of India, was badly treated by Richard Nixon, then president of USA, when she came to meet him and ask for help to solve the Bangladeshis crossing over to India to escape the atrocities committed on them by Pakistani Army.

She was made to wait 15 minutes outside Nixon's office before she was asked to come inside his office. Indira Gandhi went inside and refused to talk to Nixon, said good-by and left with solid determination in her mind to solve the problem on her own. Capt. RD Singh founder director of GIVE could not make it to the celebration. All three Army veterans were recognized and given bouquets to honor them. Other members who had some recollection of 1971 war also spoke out of their memories and what experience they had during 1971 war. A tribute was also paid to General Bipin Rawat who was recently killed in a Helicopter crash. The celebration ended with a sumptuous dinner.

Pandit Birju Maharaj, the legendary Kathak style dance guru, died earlier this month at the age of 83. It is often said that he could play (dance) a woman better than a woman. He was known not only for his ethereal footwork but also for abhinaya – shringar. It was quoted recently in a tribute to him that Birju Maharaj had said, that stage spotlights were only for external things to create an atmosphere. He explained further how he would create atmosphere with his artform, "If I was performing in the winter and the piece was set in the summer, the audience had to feel the hot and dry summer winds...such needs to be the power of expression". To the Kathak dance followers, his death is a great loss but his legacy lives on through all the performances he gave during his life time and now his students will continue to do so.
