I am Enrico Fermi, father of nuclear science in America.

I am the first enlisted man to earn the Medal of Honor in World War II; I am John Basilone of New Jersey. I am an Italian-American.



ITALIAN FOOD AND THE POLITICS OF ITALIAN-AMERICAN IDENTITY IN THE 21ST CENTURY

In June 2017, Dr. Rocco Mesiti was invited to present a paper at the Italian American Studies Association (IASA) International Conference in Italy. The conference was held at the Università della Calabria, Cosenza Italy under the patronage of the Rome Fulbright Office. Dr. Mesiti presented his research paper, “Italian When We Eat: The Politics of Identity Development in the 21st Century” and his study was well-received. Dr. Mesiti generously offered to share this presentation with the Italian Cultural Center. As consumers today, we are often bombarded with authentic and pseudo-Italian products. How does this affect contemporary Italians? And why is it so important for Italians to preserve their identity in today’s society.

Dr. Rocco Mesiti is a professor of Italian Culture in the College of Arts and Science at Western New England University and also a professor of the university’s successful summer program in Sorrento Italy at the Sant’Anna Institute. Currently, Dr. Mesiti, aka “*DJRocco*” is celebrating his 25th year as an Italian American Radio DJ on WTCC 90.7 FM, Dolce Vita Radio. In 2013, Dr. Mesiti received the Italian Cultural Center of Western Massachusetts’ prestigious Serviam Award.



Friday Night at the Italian Cinema



The Italian Cinema series continues with *In Guerra Per Amore (At War with Love)* by Pierfrancesco Diliberto (2016) which will be shown on Friday, November 10, 2017 at the Italian Cultural Center. The film is in Italian with English subtitles and the running time is one hour and 39 minutes, Doors will open at 6:00 pm and the movie will start at 6:30 pm. Admission is \$3.00 for members, \$6.00 for non-members. A choice of snack and beverage will be provided.

Plot: A love story set in July 1943 when Allied forces landed in Sicily. Arturo loves Flora, daughter of a restaurant owner, but she has been promised in marriage to a Mafia boss. Arturo decides to join the Allied forces and return to Sicily, which he had left in search of fortune in America. In the background is a clever narrative of how relations between Allies and the Mafia during World War II shaped the fate of Sicily in years to come. A tender love story intertwines with the allied conquer of Sicily during WW II, where the US Army had to find partners in the local society. It's a gentle comedy based on a true fact, in this case, the agreement between the US army and mafia bosses to occupy Sicily in World War II without having any trouble and resistance from the locals.

È una commedia gentile basata su un fatto realmente accaduto, in questo caso, l'accordo tra l'esercito statunitense e capi della mafia per occupare la Sicilia nella seconda guerra mondiale senza avere problemi e resistenza da parte dei locali.
