

Dachenhausem Wins Fifth on Saturday, Sadie Creeden Triumphant Sunday

Ed Dachenhausem racked up another win on Saturday, making it five for the year, seemingly enroute to the Nascar Asphalt Modified Championship. Dachenhausem had a 94 point lead over John Cote going into the event, with just four races left to the points season, and a double points night lingering on the final night.

Mac Crawson and Steve Kammer would bring the field to the initial green, for the 20 lap feature, with Dachenhausem starting 5th. Cote would Pick up the runner up position on lap 4. Crawson would continue to lead until a caution for Kammer on lap 8. The restart found Cote getting the advantage over Crawson, and Dachenhausem would pass for 2nd on the 9th lap. Caution would fly again onlap 10 for Kammer and Free Nees around. The restart would find Dachenhausem with the advantage over Cote, but caution would fly once more on lap 13. The restart on lap 14 found Dachenhausem getting the advantage again over Cote. Dachenhausem would drive to win number five, by .19 over Cote. Nees, Crawson, and Steve Galgano, would round out the top 5.

The INEX Legends feature event proved to be a great battle early on between veteran Kevin Nowak and young gun Lexi Przybylinski, seeking her 4th win of the season. Joe Przybylinski, Sr, and Chris Piasecki would pace the field for the initial start. Nowak was quickly to 2nd by lap 1, and Lexi to 2nd by lap 2 from her 5th starting spot. Lexi would take the top spot on lap 4. On lap 6 Nowak would fall to third, with Piasecki moving back forward. But the caution would fly before lap 7. The restart found Lexi and Nowak battling for the top spot, with Nowak passing Lexi on lap 10, only for the caution to fly for Lexi the following lap. The lap 12 restart found Nowak leading Piasecki, with a hard charging Lexi coming back through the field, before the caution flew yet again, with Lexi facing the wrong direction in turn 1. The final restart found no changes in the top spots, and Lexi rebounding to the top 5 by race end. The veteran Kevin Nowak prevailed over Piasecki, Dylan Flynn, Pryzubylinski Sr, Joe Przybylinski Jr, and Lexi Przybylinski.

In the 69 lap Annual Open Comp 4 cylinder "Hippie Bowl" Mike Travis would hold off teammate Robert Beach, Dan Curry, Richard Smith, and JW Gannon for the win.

Joel Murns would make it 4 in a row and 5th for the season in Nascar Street Stock action. Tucker Katz would take the win in 4 cylinder Novice. Emerson Cargain won the 4 cylinder truck feature. Madison White took the checkers in Beginner Bandoleros. Rodney Dowless Jr. would get the edge over Leland Oefelein for the win. Robert Beach would take the 50 lap "Fire on the Mountain" Open Comp Enduro.

In Small Car Sunday action, Sadie Creeden and Izabella Babcock would trade the lead back and forth throughout the 15 lap feature for Jr Sportsman ChampKarts. The winning move would come on the final turn, of the final lap, with the two coming up on lapped traffic. Creeden to the outside, and Babcock to the inside of the lap car. Creeden made her ChampKart stick on the topline, to edge Babcock at the line for the win.

Senior ChampKart action found Rookies Heath Babcock and Makaela Predmore swapping the lead several times, before Babcock took the top spot and cruised to victory.

Dennis Hummel would win the Mini Van Enduro. Mike Travis won the Open Comp Enduro. Rodney Dowless Jr would make it two for two in the INEX Bandolero event. Alyson Smith the Beginner Bandoleros, and Khloe Babcock won the Rookie ChampKart division.
