Enthusiasm

One habit that I have purposely made in my life and work in the Church is to surround myself with other Christians who are positive and enthusiastic. By doing so, I am encouraged to be more enthusiastic in my faith. Enthusiasm is a character trait, that I believe, is needed greatly among God's people. Enthusiastic Christians tend to live fully in the present and enjoy every moment of their walk with God, appreciating what they have in Christ and doing the best they can for Him. Living our faith this way and bringing an exciting attitude with you wherever you go can help to encourage and lift the excitement in those around you. For some, enthusiasm comes naturally, for others it takes effort. Here are a few things that I suggest you do if you want to be a more enthusiastic worker for the Lord.

First, be mindful of your attitude. It is so easy to become cynical, pessimistic, and negative. We already have enough of those types of folks in the Church, and they aren't helping the cause of Christ very much! Keeping a positive attitude and outlook toward your Christian walk will help you when things get tough and hard times come. Focus on all the good that is happening around you, and remember to express gratitude to God for the things you are grateful for.

Second, present yourself enthusiastically. Let the world see Christ shining in you always, even in tough times and when you don't really feel like it. I remember my father telling me, "sometimes you have to fake it to make it." Stand up straight, smile, and be a positive example to those around you. Remember, the world is watching and they want to see how you respond when things get tough. Enthusiasm is a discipline, so be purposeful about being positive and living for Christ.

Finally, identify spiritual goals in your service to God and His Church that you want to accomplish. Pray about those goals and how God can use you. Then, when you see God working and blessing you with and victories, you will have more enthusiasm about future service for His Kingdom.
