Dr. Brothers earned his B.A. from Lipscomb University (1987), M.A. from Freed-Hardeman University (1999), M.Div. from Lipscomb University (2004), and Ph.D. from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (2010). He spent 23 years in local ministry before taking a position as professor of Bible at Freed-Hardeman University in 2010 and serving in that role through May of 2018. He began his new work as President of Heritage Christian University in June of 2018. Dr. Brothers serves as a part-time missionary to Latin America, training preachers and starting Future Minister Training Camps for young men ages 12-24. He has been married to his wife, Cindy (Markham) Brothers, since 1988. They have two daughters: Katie and Hannah.


