WHAT DO WE SEE?

This past Monday I was at the monthly Ministers Lunch in Nashville. Our guest speaker was **Dr. Drake Jenkins**. He was speaking to us on his recent book, "The Visitor's View—How to Build a Flourishing Church." He was challenging all of us on how important it is to give attention to the intergenerational cultures within our congregations while keeping the biblical and scriptural integrity of the congregations, because each generational group thinks and acts differently, so allowing one generational group to be the only voice on how the church looks, acts, and evangelizes will actually hinder the congregation from reaching the lost and maintaining a healthy balance that allows the Church to grow. Dr. Jenkins challenged us to look at our congregation through the eye's of the visitor. It is always healthy to stop from time to time and do some self-evaluation. I want to share a section of the book that he read to us on Monday. It really challenged me to stop and think. I hope it does the same for you.

"When people walk into our church communities, small groups, or congregational settings, they instantly begin to see and form thoughts about you and your church family based on first impressions, initial investments, aesthetics, spiritual insights, joy and exuberance, and your ability to build an evangelistic relationship. They will begin this process of visualization and ambiguous judgment in a matter of seconds of seeing you and viewing what you have to offer. The interesting thing about this process is that you do the same thing. You instantaneously view the viewer and begin you own ambiguous judgment in a matter of milliseconds. Thus the question that all Christians might consider is: What do you see? Do you see a visitor or a future family member? Do you see baggage or benefit? Do you see who they are or what Jesus can make them? Do you focus on where they are or where Jesus can take them? What do you see? Do you see their history or see their potential holiness? Do you see their mess or their ministry? Do you want them in your fold? When the visitor views you, how are you viewing them? (pages 207 &208)


