Common Excuses for Missing Evening Worship

It's easy to make excuses for missing evening worship. Life is busy. Weekends are short. Mondays come fast. There is nothing for our children in the evenings. But sometimes the very things we use as excuses reveal how much we've lost sight of what really matters.

Some say, "I already went this morning," as if one service fulfills their duty. Others claim, "Sunday night is family time," forgetting that worship is the best family time of all — with God's family. Still others need to "rest before Monday," putting physical rest above spiritual renewal.

We might think, "The crowd is smaller; it's not the same," or "It's just a repeat of the morning." But every gathering brings its own message, encouragement, and opportunity to serve. Some insist, "We watch online," yet convenience can never replace community. Others reason, "It's not commanded in the Bible," overlooking Hebrews 10:24–25, which calls us to "not neglect meeting together."

Then there are the practical excuses: homework, work deadlines, bedtime for the kids, bad weather, or "our only night off." Yet we often push through those same obstacles for things that matter less; a game, a dinner, or a show.

The truth is, worshiping together strengthens our faith, deepens relationships, and refocuses our hearts before the week begins. Smaller gatherings often create a spirit of closeness and encouragement that large assemblies cannot.

When we say, "We'll go next week," or "I don't feel like it," we miss the blessings God has waiting for us tonight. Let's not let excuses rob us of spiritual growth. Instead, let's say, "I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord'" (Psalm 122:1).

God doesn't just want your attendance, He wants your heart. And every opportunity to worship is an invitation to draw closer to Him.





The Lesson of the Gloves



I once read a story about a young preacher. Hershel and his wife were two young adults who were new to the ministry and to the town where they served. As many young adults, they had more bills than money.

But there was hope. You see, Hershel was asked to preach a wedding. The bride-to-be was the daughter of an affluent businessman in town. Hershel hoped that he would get an honorarium for his services.

After the wedding, the bride's father presented the preacher with a small, wrapped box. When he got home that night, Hershel and his wife opened the gift and found a pair of new work gloves. Both were disappointed. They had bills.

They put the gloves in the back of their closet and forgot about them. Four months later, an unexpected cold snap blew into town. Hershel couldn't find his winter gloves, so he got out the new work gloves. As he put his hand into the gloves, he felt something inside. In each finger of the gloves was a \$20 bill. Two hundred dollars in total. That was like \$2000 in today's market.

All those months of doing without, when the money they needed was sitting in their closet, just waiting to be used.

That's like many of our blessings. Prayer, inspiration of the Bible, fellowship and encouragement of the church—all these blessings await you in Christ. All we have to do is use them.
