Living in the Newness of Life: Reflections on Romans 6

In Romans 6, Paul offers a powerful message about the transformative power of baptism and the new life we have in Christ. He begins by addressing a question many might have after hearing about God's grace: "Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound?" (Romans 6:1). Paul's answer is a resounding "No!" He explains that those who have been baptized into Christ's death are united with Him, and just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too are called to walk in the "newness of life" (Romans 6:4).

Baptism is not just a symbolic act; it is a spiritual reality. Through baptism, we are buried with Christ, and through His resurrection, we are raised to live a new life. This new life is not merely a change in behavior but a profound transformation of our identity. We are no longer slaves to sin but have been set free to live for God (Romans 6:6-7). The old self, with its sinful desires and brokenness, has been crucified with Christ, and we are now free to live according to God's righteousness.

Paul continues to remind us that the choice we make matters. We can choose to present ourselves as instruments of righteousness, yielding our lives to God, or we can continue to live in the way we did before knowing Christ. The gift of eternal life in Christ is ours when we choose to follow Him (Romans 6:23).

As we reflect on these truths, let us remember that we are not left to live this new life on our own. The Holy Spirit empowers us to walk in the freedom and victory Christ has secured for us. Let us live as those who have been set free from sin, giving glory to God in all that we do.

Let's walk in the newness of life today!





Three Words That Change Everything

There are three words, that if we really believe them, will change our perspective, our outlook, our attitude – our everything! What are they? Well, let's let one of the great people of faith, Abraham, tell us.

In Genesis 22, God asks Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac. Now, consider the fact that Isaac was the son that God promised Abraham and Sarah. He was the only one who could continue the lineage of Abraham's innumerable descendants, again as promised by God. And now, Abraham was asked to kill him! Abraham's faith in God caused him to trust and obey (Hebrews 11:17-19).

As they neared the spot God had designated to be the sacrificial place, Isaac asked his father, "Look, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" (Genesis 22:7). It is then that Abraham gives us the phrase to always remember — the phrase that changes everything: "My son, God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering." (Genesis 22:8). And He did! After passing the test of faith in the motions of going through with the sacrifice, in the nick of time, God provided a ram to be the substitute (Genesis 22:9-14).

"God will provide." Believing and saying that reminds us that no matter the circumstances in our lives, God is in control and will always act on what is in our best interest at the proper time. We must, like Abraham, trust and obey and step forward in faith knowing that "God will provide."
