Christmas at the Crossroads – "Stay or Go?"

One of the most surprising parts of the Christmas story is who God chose to receive the first birth announcement of Jesus. Not kings. Not priests. Not influential leaders. Instead, heaven opened over a lonely hillside and delivered the message to shepherds, men considered unimportant, uneducated, and spiritually unclean. In that moment, God reminded the world that His grace is not reserved for the impressive, but offered freely to the ordinary.

Luke tells us that the shepherds were simply "keeping watch over their flock by night." Nothing remarkable. Nothing spiritual. Just another work shift. Yet that's exactly where God met them. And truth be told, that's often where God meets us too, not in the extraordinary moments, but in the routine "fields" of everyday life.

After the angels departed, the shepherds faced a crossroads. They could have stayed in the field. They had plenty of excuses: They were tired... busy... uncertain... and probably felt unworthy of such a holy invitation. But instead of staying where they were, they said, "Let us go to Bethlehem." And that decision changed everything.

Their obedience led them to Jesus. Their encounter with Him filled them with joy. Their experience overflowed into worship and bold witness as they "made known the saying that had been told them." The message for us is simple: God invites each of us to leave the comfort of our familiar fields and take steps toward Him. Maybe your "field" is routine, fear, excuses, or feeling unworthy. But like the shepherds, you don't have to stay where you are.

This Christmas, choose to move toward Jesus. Take the next step of faith. Don't let anything keep you in the field when God is inviting you to Bethlehem.

Will you stay... or will you go?



In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works: in doctrine *shewing* uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity, (Titus 2:7 KJV).


