WHAT DO YOU HEAR?

Two men were walking along a bustling city sidewalk. The sound of honking cars, chatter, and footsteps filled the air. Amidst the chaos, one man remarked to the other, "Listen, can you hear that lovely sound of the cricket?"

His friend looked around, puzzled. "I can't hear anything over this noise! How can you detect the sound of a cricket amidst all this?" The first man, a trained zoologist, smiled knowingly, Instead of answering directly, the zoologist demonstrated his point. Reaching into his pocket, he pulled out a coin and dropped it onto the sidewalk. Instantly, a dozen heads turned toward the sound, all attuned to the familiar clink of money hitting the pavement. "See," he said, "people hear what they are tuned in for."

This simple story reflects a deep truth about human nature: we are often blind or deaf to things that don't immediately concern us. What we pay attention to is shaped by our priorities and our training, whether consciously or subconsciously.

Jesus touches on this idea in Matthew 6:21 when He says, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." Just as the man in the story could hear the cricket while others could not, we often only hear and see what we have trained ourselves to focus on. If our hearts are focused on material things—wealth, status, or success—those are the things we will notice. But if we train ourselves to focus on the things of God—His love, His guidance, His truth—we will begin to notice them more and more in our everyday lives.

What are we listening for in life? What have we trained ourselves to tune in to? It's so easy to get caught up in the noise of the world—the demands of work, the pressure to succeed, the distractions of entertainment—but it's essential that we train ourselves to hear God's voice amidst the clamor.




