The Joy of the Unknown

A little boy once sat in the back seat of his family car asking the age-old question every parent dreads: "Are we there yet?" His dad, with a twinkle in his eye, replied, "Son, I don't even know where 'there' is, but I promise you'll like it when we arrive!" The boy groaned, but there's a lesson for us: sometimes the journey is more important than knowing every detail of the destination.

As Christians, we often want a full map of life, laid out in advance. We want to know what tomorrow will hold, where our steps will take us, and how every trial will end. But God rarely works that way. Instead, He calls us to trust Him. Proverbs 3:5–6 reminds us: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths."

Think about Abraham, who "went out, not knowing where he was going" (Hebrews 11:8). Or Peter, stepping out of the boat, unsure if his feet would hold on the water (Matthew 14:29). Their joy was not in knowing, but in trusting, and in seeing God's faithfulness unfold.

The unknown is not something to fear but to embrace. Life in Christ is a great adventure, filled with moments where faith must walk before sight. Each twist and turn is another opportunity to lean on God, discover His promises, and rejoice in His surprising grace.

So instead of asking, "Are we there yet?" let's enjoy the ride. The joy of the unknown is found in knowing the One who holds the map.


