#### **Imitation is the Greatest Form of Flattery**

We've all heard the saying, "Imitation is the greatest form of flattery." Children often copy their parents' mannerisms, athletes model their game after a favorite player, and students admire and follow the examples of trusted teachers. Whether we realize it or not, imitation shapes much of who we are. The question for Christians is: Who are we imitating?

In Philippians, Paul reminds believers of the One we are called to model our lives after Jesus Christ. He writes, "Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men" (Philippians 2:5–7). Christ's humility, obedience, and sacrificial love are the qualities we are to reflect in our daily lives.

Paul also urged the Philippians to follow his example as he followed Christ: "Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us" (Philippians 3:17). The Christian walk is not about inventing a new way of living but about faithfully imitating the way of Jesus. When we forgive, serve, love, and put others before ourselves, we are not only honoring Christ, we are showing the world His character through us.

Our communities don't just need to hear about Jesus; they need to *see* Him in our lives. True flattery is not found in empty words but in faithful imitation. May we, like Paul, be able to say to others, "What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, practice these things" (Philippians 4:9).

We are glad to have you visiting with us today! You are welcome here. We know you have a choice of where to worship, and you chose to be with us today — thank you.


At Lomax we want to be the church we read about in the Bible. Our goal is to glorify God with our worship and with our lives and to point people to Jesus Christ.


