“WHY WE ASSEMBLE”

One of the greatest blessings God has given His people is the opportunity to come together. Every first day of the week, Christians meet for worship. But have you ever stopped to ask, Why do we assemble? What makes this gathering so important that the Bible urges us never to neglect it?

First, We Assemble to Obey God’s Command. In Hebrews 10:24–25, Christians are reminded not to forsake the assembling of ourselves together. This isn’t just a suggestion—it is God’s command. Meeting together is part of the life God expects His people to live. When we gather, we are putting God’s will above our own convenience, and in doing so we honor Him.

Second, We Assemble to Worship God as a Family. Worship is not about entertainment or preference. It is about giving praise, honor, and glory to the Lord who has redeemed us. When we sing, we teach and admonish one another in psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs (Colossians 3:16). When we pray, we approach the throne of God together. When we partake of the Lord’s Supper, we proclaim the Lord’s death until He comes again (1 Corinthians 11:26). Worship reminds us of God’s greatness, and it centers our hearts on Him.

Third, We Assemble to Encourage One Another. The Christian walk can be difficult. At times, it can even feel lonely. But when we come together, we remind each other that we are not walking this road alone. A kind word, a smile, or even just the presence of fellow Christians can strengthen our faith. Our assemblies are opportunities to “stir up one another to love and good works” (Hebrews 10:24). In a world that often tears us down, the Lord’s church builds us up.

And forth, We Assemble to Prepare for Eternity. Worship is a glimpse of heaven. In Revelation, John describes the multitudes gathered around the throne of God, singing and praising Him. Every Lord’s Day assembly is a foretaste of that eternal gathering. When we come together now, we are training our hearts for the day when we will stand before God forever.

Our assemblies matter. They are not something to take lightly or treat as optional. They are not just something we “have to do”—they are something we get to do. Each time we gather, we grow closer to God and to one another. May we always remember the blessing and the responsibility of assembling with the saints.


