Garbage In, Garbage Out

Computers have a funny way of teaching us spiritual lessons. Programmers have a saying: "Garbage in, garbage out." In other words, if you put bad data into the system, you shouldn't be surprised when the results come back looking like a dumpster fire.

The same principle applies to our Christian lives. What we feed our hearts and minds will eventually show up in the way we live, speak, and interact with others. If we constantly soak up negativity, bad language, gossip, or pessimism, then "surprise!," that's what will spill out of our mouths. Jesus put it plainly: "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks" (Matthew 12:34).

Imagine a Christian who tries to convince the world of the joy of Christ, but their face always looks like they just sucked on a lemon. Or one who sings "Oh, how I love Jesus" on Sunday, but by Tuesday is grumbling, criticizing, and spreading doom and gloom. That's garbage in, garbage out, and the world notices.

On the flip side, when we fill our minds with God's Word, prayer, uplifting conversations, and gratitude, what comes out is encouragement, kindness, and light. Paul reminded the Philippians to think on "whatever is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, commendable..." (Philippians 4:8). When that's what we take in, that's what will come out—and the world needs more of it.

The Challenge: This week, take inventory of your inputs. What are you reading? Watching? Listening to? Who are you spending the most time with? Are those things filling your heart with garbage or with goodness? Choose to put in what will build you up in Christ so that what comes out of you will point others to Him.

Let's show the world that a life filled with Jesus overflows with joy, grace, and hope!


