The Perils of a Close-Minded Spirit

Being a close-minded Christian means shutting yourself off from growth, correction, and new insights from Scripture or other believers. This kind of mindset not only holds back your spiritual growth but also keeps you from fully living out God's plan for your life. Proverbs 12:1 puts it plainly: "Whoever loves discipline loves knowledge, but whoever hates correction is stupid." If you're not willing to learn or change, you're basically rejecting wisdom.

Think about the Pharisees in Jesus' time. Even though they saw His miracles and heard His powerful teachings, they just couldn't accept that He was the Messiah. Their stubbornness blinded them to the truth. Jesus called them out, saying, "You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me, yet you refuse to come to me that you may have life" (John 5:39-40). Their close-mindedness led them away from the very salvation they were looking for.

We're all called to grow continuously. Peter tells us to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). But spiritual growth takes humility—a willingness to be corrected and to adjust our thinking when needed. Proverbs 27:17 says, "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." We need each other to stay aligned with God's Word.

If we reject correction or ignore different perspectives, we risk becoming spiritually stuck. Instead, we should aim to have a teachable heart, always seeking to align ourselves with God's truth. By embracing humility and being open to learning, we pave the way for deeper faith, greater wisdom, and a closer walk with God.

Let's not be close-minded. Instead, let's stay open to God's transformative work in our lives.



Hanging decorations moved gently in the breeze while tunes played from the Bluetooth speaker. It was time for the party!

As the time for the gathering came and went none of the invited guest arrived. Perhaps the traffic was bad or other distractions were holding up the party goers. Just as in our previous example, the bible class teacher may sit in an empty classroom and say, "No one has come." Let us all give appreciative consideration to those that work so hard to make it possible for us to worship the Lord in spirit and in truth.
