Are You Wasting What God Has Given You?

Have you ever looked back on a day and thought, "Where did my time go?" Or maybe you've had opportunities to serve but let them slip by. As Christians, we must ask ourselves: Are we using what God has given us wisely, or are we wasting it?

Jesus tells a sobering parable in Matthew 25:14-30 about three servants entrusted with their master's money. Two invested wisely and were rewarded, but one buried his talent out of fear and laziness. The master rebuked him, calling him "wicked and lazy" (v. 26). The lesson? God expects us to use our time, resources, and abilities for His glory—not to squander them.

Paul reminds us in Ephesians 5:15-16 to "be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil." Our time is limited, and how we spend it reflects our priorities. Are we using our days to grow spiritually, serve others, and glorify God? Or are we caught up in distractions that have no eternal value?

Being wasteful isn't just about money—it's about neglecting the gifts and talents God has given us. 1 Peter 4:10 says, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace." When we don't use our abilities for God's kingdom, we're not just missing opportunities—we're disobeying Him.

So, let's do a self-check. Are we investing in what truly matters? Let's commit to being good stewards, using every resource, talent, and moment for God's purposes. After all, when we stand before Him, we want to hear, "Well done, good and faithful servant."




