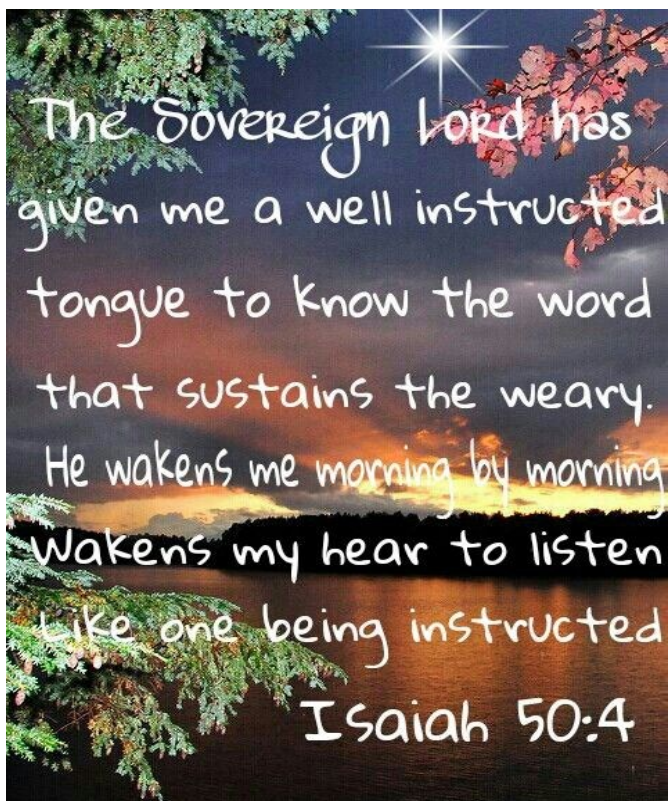

Sunday's Reflection

We have just read the passion of our Lord Jesus Christ in Luke's Gospel. This passion dominates holy week and is central to our whole Christian faith.

Notice what this Passion, death and Resurrection of Jesus tells us about our *God*. For the essential paradox of Christianity is not precisely that Jesus died and rose again; rather the eternal paradox is that *only after* the disgraceful kind of death Jesus suffered, did God raise him to victory. Jesus' human fiasco—of rejection, passion, failure, and humiliation—is forever a part of God's revelation of his kingdom and our way of salvation. His cross is the clearest sign of Christianity and of God's love. Without the cross, the Resurrection of Christ might give us an understanding of God as triumphal, victorious and heavenly. But because of the cross of Christ—along with his resurrection—we have God's understanding of himself as a God totally involved with our suffering and sinful world, a God who is forever known as compassionate, forgiving and loving in the whole struggle of human living. He does not do away with suffering, but shows a way through it.

Second, notice what Jesus' passion tells us about our *human life*. What we learn only slowly is that this passion of Jesus is the paradigm for our whole Christian life. It is not only the means of the world's redemption; it is the model for our Christian life. Jesus our Savior makes this clear several times in the Gospels. He invites us to *follow* him and somehow die with him. And Luke's Gospel says it best: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross *daily* and follow me" (Luke 9:23). This means that our whole spirituality as Christians is a Christological spirituality, a constant, natural dying with Christ. The great theologian, Karl Rahner, comments on this very passage, "The Christian, every Christian, at all times, follows Jesus by dying with him." This dying is entirely individual and unique for each one of us. Concretely, it consists of accepting the will of God, as seen in the sometimes difficult, daily life that comes to us humanly. This holy week, as we meditate on Jesus' Passion and Resurrection, let us learn what it tells us about our God, and what it means for our daily following of Jesus, our model.

Acabamos de leer la pasión de nuestro Señor Jesucristo en el Evangelio de Lucas. Esta pasión domina la Semana Santa y es central para toda nuestra fé cristiana.

Fijémonos en lo que esta pasión, muerte y resurrección de Jesús nos dice de nuestro Dios. Porque la paradoja esencial del cristianismo no es precisamente que Jesús muriera y resucitara, sino que la paradoja eterna es que sólo después de la vergonzosa clase de muerte que sufrió Jesús, Dios lo resucitó a la victoria. El fiasco humano de Jesús -el rechazo, la pasión, el fracaso y la humillación- forma parte para siempre de la revelación divina de su reino y de nuestro camino de salvación. Su cruz es el signo más claro del cristianismo y del amor de Dios. Sin la cruz, la Resurrección de Cristo podría darnos una comprensión de Dios triunfal, victoriosa y celestial. Pero gracias a la cruz de Cristo -junto con su resurrección- tenemos la comprensión de Dios como un Dios totalmente implicado con nuestro mundo sufriente y pecador, un Dios que es conocido para siempre como compasivo, perdonador y amoroso en toda la lucha de la vida humana. No elimina el sufrimiento, sino que muestra un camino para superarlo.

En segundo lugar, observen lo que la pasión de Jesús nos dice sobre nuestra vida humana. Lo que aprendemos poco a poco es que esta pasión de Jesús es el paradigma de toda nuestra vida cristiana. No es sólo el medio de la redención del mundo; es el modelo de nuestra vida cristiana. Jesús, nuestro Salvador, lo deja claro varias veces en los Evangelios. Nos invita a seguirle y, en cierto modo, a morir con él. Y el Evangelio de Lucas lo dice mejor "Si alguno quiere venir en pos de mí, niéguese a sí mismo, tome su cruz cada día y sígame" (Lc 9, 23). Esto significa que toda nuestra espiritualidad como cristianos es una espiritualidad cristológica, un constante y natural morir con Cristo. El gran teólogo Karl Rahner comenta este mismo pasaje: «El cristiano, todo cristiano, en todo momento, sigue a Jesús muriendo con Él». Este morir es totalmente individual y único para cada uno de nosotros. Concretamente, consiste en aceptar la voluntad de Dios, tal como se manifiesta en la vida cotidiana, a veces difícil, que se nos presenta humanamente. Esta semana santa, al meditar sobre la Pasión y Resurrección de Jesús, aprendamos lo que esos hechos nos dicen sobre nuestro Dios, y lo que significa para nuestro seguimiento diario de Jesús, quién es nuestro modelo.
