TIPS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (an important read)

We want your wedding photos to be flawless. We will be unobtrusive and ready to capture your special moments. Here are some suggestions for you:

One of the most requested images is the 'first look' capturing the first time you and your partner see each other – sometimes this can be hampered by the wedding party itself, this is easily rectified by asking bridesmaids/groomsmen to walk down the isle some distance in front of you, this way we can capture both the arrival of your wedding party and then the bride.

In order to allow for a private photo session of bride and groom, we will need at least 45 minutes (maybe slightly longer if sunset is required away from your venue) of your time. Please note that any guests including family not involved in the formal portraits should proceed to the cocktail reception. The more people around, the longer it can take to complete the formal portrait session. The personal portraits of just the two of you will only include yourselves and the photographers.

All your guests will have digital cameras and all your guests will understandably want to photograph you on your special day. However, just something for you to think about, we suggest that during your ceremony you ask your guests to refrain from using their phones/iPads/cameras, this is an intimate part of your day and your professional photos will only show a sea of electronic equipment rather than your guests enjoying your special time.

Bear in mind to ensure the presence of all the family and friends required for your formal wedding photos. It always takes some time to gather people together and pose them so that everyone can be seen, etc. Having a 'helper' for these photos is always a quick way to ensure they stay to time, either a Groomsman or Bridesmaid as a helper is an invaluable part of this time, especially when they know the guests they are looking for.

One great tip to think about is your beautiful wedding reception set up and speeches. Apart from the fact that most people are nervous before giving formal speeches, you have spent so much time, effort and money to make your tables look beautiful, if you decide to have the speeches after dinner please bear in mind that they will be littered with glasses, napkins, favours removed and generally not looking at their best photography wise.

Another top tip is your wedding shoes, if you plan to go on location such as sea caves or sandy beaches, these can be very harsh areas for your beautiful new wedding shoes, it is always handy to bring along flip flops, trainers or something similar to ensure your shoes remain perfect for your reception.
