




THE HISTORY OF WINEGROWING IN VIRGINIA



FROM THE EARLY 1600'S UP THROUGH TODAY





1619 "Acte 12" Passed by House of Burgesses

The history of winegrowing dates to 1619 when the Virginia House of Burgesses passed a bill called "ACTE 12" requiring each male land holder to plant a minimum of 10 vines for future production of wine. The British hopes were to supplant their reliance on the French for wine.





THOMAS JEFERSON & Wine in Virginia

In 1773 Jefferson formed the Virginia Wine Company whose members total 25 prominent early American Leaders such as George Washington and George Mason.

MONTICELLO WINE COMPANY IS ESTABLISHED IN CHARLOTTESVILLE 1873.

They quickly earn acclaim in competitions for their Virginia Claret produced from Norton.

BY 1888 THERE ARE 3,000 ACRES OF VINES PLANTED IN ALBEMARLE COUNTY ALONE.



PROHIBITION & VIRGINIA


Although the 18th Amendment didn't take effect until 1920, Virginia was ahead of it's time with a referendum in 1914 banning alcohol statewide. It passed overwhelmingly. It would take effect on **November 1, 1916, four years** ahead of the ratification of the **18th Amendment to the Constitution.**



Bishop James Cannon

Best known as a relentless advocate for Prohibition, Cannon led the Virginia Anti-Saloon League's campaign for statewide Prohibition, adopted in 1914.

Cannon was the founder of the Richmond Virginian newspaper and used it as a vehicle to promote his anti-alcohol agenda.


THE VIRGINIA WINE EXPERIENCE AT The HOMESTEAD RESORT
