### ***National Spotlight: Hudson Westbrook – Neo-Traditionalist on the Rise: Why Hudson Westbrook Is Your Next Country Obsession***



#### ***Hudson Westbrook.***

Hudson Westbrook is a Texas singer-songwriter who was in relative obscurity until the later half of 2024, when his music began to gain significant traction. Growing up steeped in the influences of '90s country icons like George Strait, his sound blends classic sentiments with a modern edge. He first began releasing music in April 2024 and quickly made a name for himself, catapulting into the spotlight with a viral hit.

#### **Latest Song**

His propulsive blue-collar love song, “5 to 9,” was released in August 2024 and quickly became a hit across country corners of TikTok and streaming platforms. You can listen to “5 to 9” and other tracks from his debut self-titled EP on major streaming platforms like Apple Music, Spotify, or YouTube Music.

Westbrook sits comfortably at the crossroads of Texas dancehalls and commercial country, a style that resonates with fans longing for an organic, authentic sound. With his rapid rise and a sound that appeals to both traditionalists and new listeners, we imagine he’ll only going to keep digging for gold in the new year.
