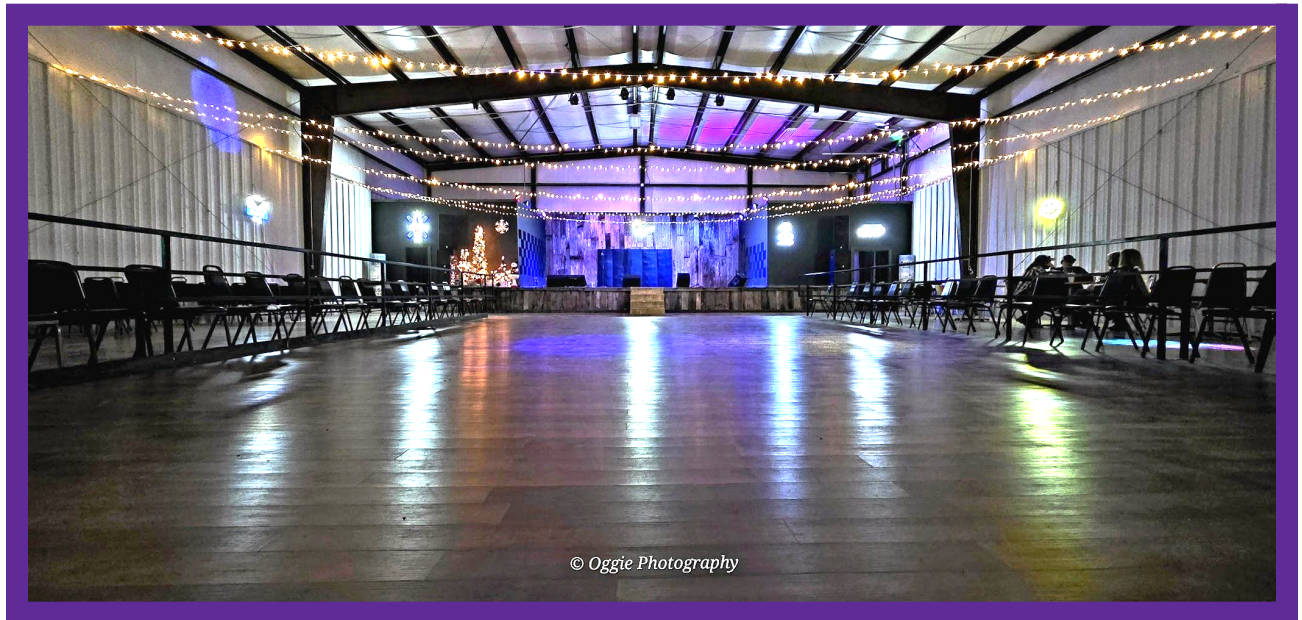
## Your Ultimate Dance Week Starts Here!

Since opening its doors in April 2025, this blue-clad dance hall has quickly become a crown jewel for Southern Missouri, boasting a massive 2,000 sq. ft. LVP floor that is absolute perfection for two-stepping, swing, and line dancing. From meeting the owners, Stacey and Jeramiah, to diving into a plate of their incredible hand-breaded fish and chips, the welcoming atmosphere at this West Plains gem is exactly what the country community needs.

### *National Spotlight: Rascal Flatts - Life is a Highway tour extended!*

After a four-year hiatus that left a void in the genre's vocal harmony scene, Gary LeVox, Jay DeMarcus, and Joe Don Rooney are reuniting to celebrate 25 years of hits. Known for their polished crossover appeal and soaring anthems that defined the early 2000s, the band is reclaiming their throne at a time when nostalgic 2000s country music is trending more than ever. Their return isn't just a trip down memory lane; it's a masterclass in the melodic storytelling and high-octane production that originally paved the way for many of today's biggest stars.



#### Latest Song

While the band is focusing on their massive catalog for the anniversary tour, fans are revisiting their classic multi-platinum hits like "Life Is a Highway" and "Bless the Broken Road." To get in the spirit for their return, you can stream their *25 Years of Rascal Flatts* collection on Spotify or Apple Music.

The trio is hitting the road for the highly anticipated "[Life Is a Highway Tour](#)" starting in early 2026. #### Why We're Watching Them in the Upcoming Year

2026 marks the official silver anniversary of Rascal Flatts, and the industry is buzzing about their first live performances together since 2020. We are watching them closely because their reunion signifies a return to the vocal-driven, "big-chorus" country music that is perfect for large-scale singalongs. With rumors of potential new music to accompany the tour, they are set to be the biggest comeback story of the year.

## *Boots, Beats, Life Spotlight: The 90s Country Revival: Dancing the Night Away with Whiskey Morning Band”*



Founded by singer-songwriter Suzy Bacino, the Whiskey Morning Band (WMB) is a 90s-heavy country cover band with a "rocking edge". Known for their professional sound and "good, old-fashioned twang," the group consists of veteran musicians from the St. Louis

circuit who share a deep love for country music. They have built a reputation as one of the most danceable bands in the region, focusing on hits that keep the floor moving.

### Latest Song

While they are celebrated for their authentic covers of 90s country icons, the band also performs original music. Their album, *The Here and Now*, features songs written by Bacino and was recorded right here in St. Louis at Sawhorse Studios.

### Where to See Them

After closing out a busy 2025 at the Trainwreck Saloon, the Whiskey Morning Band is hitting the ground running for the new year. You can catch their high-energy traditional sets at several St. Louis staples in early 2026, including a return to **Trainwreck Saloon Westport** on **Friday, January 23, 2026**. They are also a frequent favorite at the **Lindenwood Park Concert Series** and various regional festivals. ## This Week's Featured Article

### 2026 Year in Review – The Search for a New “Dance Home”

The St. Louis country dance community faced a significant turning point in 2025 with the sudden closing of **Diamond Music Hall** in St. Peters. The loss created a massive vacuum, leaving hundreds of line dancers and two-steppers without their primary "dance home." While the void was felt deeply, the resilience of our local scene has been inspiring. Throughout the year, several venues stepped up to offer new opportunities, and while none have quite rivaled the scale of Diamond yet, two contenders are showing immense potential for 2026.

The **Bottleneck Blues Bar at Ameristar Casino** in St. Charles has become a major midweek hub, opening Wednesday nights specifically for country music and dancing. Meanwhile, **The Quarry** is under new ownership and undergoing an expansion that includes plans for a dedicated monthly line dance night. Coupled with the consistency of **The Marquee at New Town** (featured in last week's issue) and the recent addition of weekly dance nights at **Rec Hall STL**, the community is slowly but surely finding its footing again. The landscape changed in 2025, but the beat hasn't skipped a second.
