



West Hill Golf Club INFORMATION FOR VISITING GOLFERS



History

West Hill Golf Club was founded in 1909 and is a typical Surrey heathland course, comprising a harmonious blend of heather and mature trees.

The Club is regularly featured in listings of the Top 100 courses and is home to the famous Father & Son Tournament which was first played in 1931.

West Hill is situated in Brookwood, Surrey on the A322 Bagshot to Guildford road. Further details can be found on the Club's website.

General Information

Handicaps ~ It is not a requirement to produce a handicap certificate, but, all visitors are expected to be competent golfers.

Tees ~ Except with the prior permission of the Secretary visitors are required to play from the Yellow tees (6036 yards). Ladies play from the Red LGU tees (5662 yards).

Format ~ Fourballs are not normally permitted in the mornings.

Equipment Hire ~ Caddies, Trolleys, Electric Trolleys and Buggies can be booked through the Professional's Shop on 01483 473172.

Payment ~ please book into the Professional's Shop on your arrival. The corporate/society organiser is to check into the Secretary's office on their arrival.

Practice Facilities ~ the Club has a full length practice range, a putting green, a short game area and three practice nets.

Etiquette ~ Visitors are requested to conform to established golfing etiquette, be aware of other players and call other players through if necessary. Visitors should play briskly and always maintain their position on the course. Please repair pitch marks on greens and replace divots on the fairways. **Trolleys must be kept out of the heather.**

Catering ~ Coffee and breakfast snacks are available from 7.30 Monday - Friday. A range of food is served in the Spike Bar until 6.00pm in the summer and 5.00pm in the winter (hot food is served until 3.30pm). Evening catering is normally only available for groups of 30 or more.

Security ~ the Club regrets it accepts no liability for the loss or theft of visitors' property on the course, in the car park or in the Clubhouse.

Accommodation ~ Please contact the Secretary's office for a list of local hotels and guest houses.

Membership ~ please contact the Secretary's office for information on current availability and prices.

Dress Code

On the Course

Footwear ~ Proper golfing footwear must be worn with either spikes or soft spikes. Trainers are not permitted.

Shirts ~ Gentlemen's shirts must have sleeves and a collar, polo or turtle neck. They must be tucked into the waistband of trousers. Tee-shirts, track suits, rugby/soccer shirts and denim shirts are not permitted. Ladies shirts without sleeves must have collars.

Shorts and Trousers ~ Gentlemen may wear trousers or tailored shorts (preferably with a belt). Ladies may wear tailored trousers, cut-offs and shorts/skirts of an appropriate length. Denim jeans, cargo pants and trousers/shorts fitted with patch pockets, or drawstring waist or legs are not permitted.

Socks ~ For Gentlemen - when worn with shorts socks must be long (one colour) or white, over the ankle with a discrete logo allowed. Ladies may wear sports socks or sockettes.

Headwear ~ If caps or hats with peaks are worn, the peak must face forward.

In and around the Clubhouse

Hats must not be worn in the Clubhouse. Neither trainers nor flipflops are allowed. Gentlemen are expected to wear socks at all times unless wearing deck shoes.

Bedser Bar (Spike Bar)

Golf clothing is permitted. Smart casual dress is acceptable at all times.

Lubbock Lounge (Lounge)

Smart casual dress is acceptable, although the Club's preferred dress code is collared jacket, trousers and shirt with tie, or roll-neck sweater. Please note that no shorts or golf shoes are allowed.

Dining Room

Collared jacket with tie or roll-neck sweater. For those playing 36-holes; dry golf clothing may be worn at lunchtime. Any further relaxation of the jacket and tie rule is subject to the permission of the Secretary. **Please note that no shorts or golf shoes** are allowed in the dining room.

Mobile Phones ~ May only be used in the car park area and must **never** be used for voice calls or messages in the Clubhouse or on the course (except in an emergency). Mobile devices may however be used for non voice activity (diaries, golf related applications etc) providing nothing impinges on the enjoyment of other members and guests.

The above may only be changed on the authority of the Captain or the Secretary.
