

Rise of Digital Ecosystems


Digital ecosystems are a long-term play to manage costs, enhance consumer experience, scale-up business models, and to obtain competitive edge in a disruptive and changing environment

Health Literacy and Consumer Engagement	Wellness Challenges and Rewards	Achieve health and wellness goals by competing with friends, earning status badges, and redeeming benefits
	Health Coach	Utilize smart sensors, like fitness watches, to track data and send consumer personalized health advice
Screening and Diagnosis	Digital Twin	Recommend next best steps for treatment options based on current clinical guidelines and other similar patients with similar symptoms
	Precision Insights	Receive personalized medical treatment that is tailored towards one's genetics and environmental factors at the right time
Access to Care	Telemedicine	Have simple and easy access to clinicians through video

Pre-COVID State Trends

- Parity legislation requiring equal reimbursement for telehealth is becoming the norm
- Almost 60% of states have signed onto the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact
- Rules for a patient's location during telehealth encounters are becoming more flexible (e.g. home, school)
- Expansion of telehealth modality beyond live-video
- Expansion of provider types ranging from dentists to social workers

Geographic / Site Location	Allowing home, conduct telehealth with patients located in their homes and outside of designated rural areas		
Eligible Services	Expanded , increase coverage of types of services eligible		
Modality	Allowing phone		
Type of Providers	Expanded, allowed other providers such as Allied Health Professionals		
Reimbursement	Pay parity, for at least some telehealth services (39 states)		
Prior existing relationship	Increased flexibility, For example, Washington Medicaid is allowing providers to serve new patients (rather than only established patients) during the pandemic
