- Keep doors and doors I locked at all times.
- Always turn off holiday lights when you leave the house unattended or when going to bed.

- Make sure paths are clear so no one trips on wrapping paper, decorations, toys, etc.
- Collect your newspaper and mail as soon as they arrive or ask a neighbor to collect.
- Place a large pair of men's work boots near the door, and make sure they are scuffed up to make them look worn.
- Put a large dog bowl near the entryways of the home, but make sure it looks realistic. Do this by adding a chewed up toy or large leash to the scene.
