ORDINANCE NO. 2019.03

911 ADDRESS SIGNAGE SYSTEM

Section 1. 911 ADDRESS SIGN PLACEMENT.

When each dwelling or building has been assigned its respective number address, the owner, occupant, or agent shall be required to purchase and display the assigned number in a conspicuous place immediately in front of the structure. The sign must be posted near the sidewalk, driveway, mailbox, gatepost, fence, or appropriate place as to clearly be visible from the road or street. If the address is posted on the mailbox, that mailbox must be located on the same property and on the same side of the road as the residence.

Costs and installation of the sign must be paid for by the property owner or occupant.
(1991 SC Code 23-47-60) (D) (1 & 2)

Section 2. 911 ADDRESS SIZE, COLOR, AND COMPOSITION OF THE SIGN AND NUMBERS.

Business and residential numbers must be at least three (3) inches in height. All signs must be blue in color and the numbers white made of a durable, clearly visible material and must contrast with the color of the business or house. 1991 SC Code 23-47-60) (D) (2)

Section 3. 911 ADDRESS SIGN LOCATION, MORE THAN FIFTY (50) FEET FROM CURB.

In cases where the business or house is situated more than fifty (50) feet from the street or road, the building must also have a sign that is visible from the road or street. The sign must be placed on the building immediately above, on, or at the side of the appropriate door so that the number is clearly visible from the road or street, and near the sidewalk, driveway, mailbox, gatepost, fence, or other appropriate place so as to clearly be visible from the road or street. If the address is posted on the mailbox, that mailbox must be located on the same property and on the same side of the road as the residence. (1991 SC Code 23-47-60) (D) (3)

Section 4. PENALTY.

Businesses, owners, residents, or others who fail to comply with this ordinance are guilty of a misdemeanor, triable in magistrate's court, and upon conviction, must be fined not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or imprisoned more than thirty (30) days. Each day in violation constitutes a separate offense.
