First Responder agencies are frequently requested by schools, businesses, and community members for direction and presentations on what to do if confronted with an active attacker event. The Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events course, designed and built on the Avoid, Deny, Defend / Run, Hide, Fight strategy developed by ALERRT in 2004, provides strategies, guidance and a proven plan for surviving an active shooter event, which empowers civilians to make life-saving decisions before first responders ever arrive. Participants in this four (4) hour Train-the-Trainer course will receive a manual and PowerPoint presentation suitable for use in their own presentations.

This course pairs the civilian response with the Dominating Pre-Hospital Hemorrhage which empowers responders to provide life-saving medical aid. This course is geared towards the First Responder and may be substituted with Stop-the-Bleed when presenting to civilians.

Topics include the history and prevalence of active shooter events, civilian response options, medical issues, and considerations for conducting drills, so that you will be prepared to carry this information into your communities.

Recommended Equipment: Good attitude, open mind, pen and paper

There is no charge for this training. It is funded through state and federal grants. The Registration Fee goes towards host costs.
