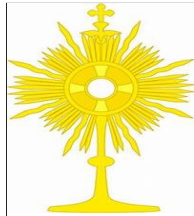

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

November 6, 2022

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Facing her 50th birthday and recently diagnosed with Type-2 Diabetes, Rebecca was at a crossroads. Realizing that she had neglected her health and fitness over the years and allowed herself to gain significant weight, she felt poorly about who she had become. While it was easier to give in to temptation and the gratification received from food, her family needed her, and she desired a long life. She had an image of the person she could become. She wanted to be more trim, focused, disciplined, and healthy. She liked what she saw in her mind and set out on a journey to create it. With great effort, she succeeded and accomplished her goals. When we have a goal ahead of us, we are more apt to do whatever is necessary to get it.

Is heaven a goal you want to achieve? Our popular images and metaphors to describe heaven can leave some people wondering if this is something they want for all eternity. Living like an angel, wearing white robes, meeting St. Peter, and reconnecting with loved ones are all welcome notions to some extent. But do they really inspire and captivate us enough to want to dramatically change how we live our lives? Heaven's reality is more profound than any human image or idea can fathom. Even though we believe in a bodily resurrection, heaven is more about attaining union with God. To achieve heaven is to attain eternal happiness and fulfill all desire. How do we awaken within us an ardent and passionate desire for heaven?

St. Isaac of Ninevah counsels, "Enter eagerly into the treasure house that lies within you, and so you will see the treasure house of heaven, for the two are one and the same, and there is but one single entry into them both. The ladder that leads to the kingdom is hidden with you, and is found in your own soul. Dive into yourself and in your soul you will discover the rungs by which to ascend." Our souls are made to be eternal. Once we discover our true selves and are captivated by the wonder of who we really are, we will unleash our unwavering desire for a lasting union with our Creator. MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO – ALENTAR UN ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA (Gospel Meditations)

6 de noviembre de 2022

32º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

¿Has pensado alguna vez sobre cómo será cielo? ¿cómo será todo allá? Te has imaginado el reencuentro con tus seres queridos. ¡Qué gran felicidad! Todo será mejor que esto, de acuerdo a la promesa de Jesús. Tenemos reservada una morada en la vida eterna. La lectura del libro de los Macabeos nos da ejemplo de la forma de pensar de los siete hermanos. Es de admirarse su valentía y esperanza en la vida eterna. Estaban convencidos que la muerte física los prepararía para la resurrección. “El segundo hermano, estando para morir, dijo: ¡No eres más que un criminal! Nos quitas la vida presente, pero el Rey del Universo nos resucitará a una vida eterna” (2 Macabeos 7,9).

Vivir con desapego de las cosas del mundo es un verdadero arte, y aún más tenerlas y saberlas compartir, sabiendo que nada nos llevaremos al morir es una verdadera gracia. ¿Conoces a alguien que viva así? VIDA PARROQUIAL

Requisitos Para Bautizos

1. Padres y Padrinos deben estar registrados.
2. Padres y Padrinos deben tomar una clase pre-bautismal primero antes de apartar la fecha de bautismo.
3. Si los niños son mayores de 7 años tienen que tomar una clase especial.
4. Si los padres quieren que otro sacerdote bautice al niño, la familia debe comunicarse con ese sacerdote por su cuenta y luego comunicarse con la parroquia para programar la fecha.
5. Si los padrinos están en otra parroquia pueden tomar las clases en esa parroquia y traer una carta con sello enseñando que tomaron las clases en su parroquia.
6. Los Padrinos tienen que tener:
 - 16 años o más
 - Ser bautizado en la iglesia Católica
 - Tener certificado de Confirmación (**necesitamos una copia**)
7. Los padrinos solo pueden ser un hombre y una mujer casados por la iglesia o solo un hombre soltero y/o una sola mujer soltera.
8. Si los padrinos están casados por la iglesia **necesitamos una copia del certificado de matrimonio.**
10. Se pide una donación de \$40.00 para la iglesia para ayudar con el sustento de la parroquia. Por favor cubra esta donación al apartar la fecha.
