Hello to all and Happy New Year 2025! For those of you who have renewed your KC Chapter Dues--THANK YOU!!! If you are not sure if you renewed---please contact me to check. I HIGHLY recommend renewing your \$25 Annual Chapter Dues online at the NCRS.ORG website the same time you renew your National Dues---that way nothing slips through the cracks! In fact when you do it---renew for \$50 for 2 years! That way you won't have to worry for 2 years if you've paid or not.

At our last Chapter meeting---I reported having 112 paid members. Since I'm new to this position---I accounted incorrectly as we show 112 members total---but only 78 are currently paid. NCRS Award Programs

Founder's Award

NCRS Founders Award

Have you campaigned your beautiful Corvette in the Flight or Concours process and are looking for some more excitement? Then you should consider pursuing the NCRS Founders Award.

PURPOSE AND DESCRIPTION

This award was created with two purposes in mind:

- 1) To encourage and recognize the value and enjoyment in participation of the many various NCRS activities
- 2) To confirm the NCRS commitment to recognizing the significance of NCRS members driving their Corvettes, regardless of the Flight judging status achieved

This award is presented at the National Convention by one of the Founding Fathers of the NCRS.

AWARD PREREQUISITES

Within the award year or three preceding calendar years, a member with the car under identical ownership must

- 1) Be a member of a NCRS chapter throughout the prerequisite period.
- 2) Achieve any NCRS Flight award at a Chapter event, driven both ways. This must be completed prior to attempting #3 below.
- 3) Drive both ways to/from a regional event and earn a minimum score of 96% on an operations check. The appropriate National Team Leader or National PV Judge will conduct the Operations Check only at a regional event operation checks at chapter or national events are not acceptable. There is no allowance for repairs or adjustments; however, unlike the standard NCRS Operations Check, the Founders Operational Check will be done on a Functional basis as opposed to being both appropriate and functional. If the item functions fully and properly, for example a cassette radio that replaces a Wonderbar radio or a quartz clock conversion may replace an original mechanical movement, no deductions will be noted. Bonus points for NCRS decal, battery cut-off switch and fire extinguishers will be counted.
- 4) Be at lease a Level 1 or higher rating as an NCRS judge or tabulator.
- 5) Draft an article for <u>The Corvette Restorer</u> magazine. The article must be submitted and approved by the editor. The approved article does not have to be published, just approved for publication in future issues. Technical or how-to articles are given preference.

Founder's Award (continued)

- 6) Participate in a NCRS National Corvette Road tour this is defined as registering, joining and driving with the tour a minimum of the final 500 miles on any National NCRS planned/recognized route.
- 7) Display the car at the National Convention under the same rules which applies to other cars. The appropriate National Team Leader will check the car to verify that it appears to display NCRS Flight Award prerequisite qualities. If so, the Team Leader or a Team will perform an Operations Check as described in #3 above and the car must score a minimum of 96%.

This award will be similar in stature to Duntov, McLellan, Hill, Bowtie, Crossed Flags and Folz plaques. Add-on plates are available for cars that register for the award in subsequent years assuming certain qualifications are met.

In addition to this award, the NCRS have several additional awards that are not dependent on Flight or Concours Judging – look for information on those awards in future chapter newsletters.

Note: The above information is a condensed description of the NCRS Founders Award. For full details, refer to Section 11 on pages 75 -76 of the NCRS Corvette Judging Reference Manual 9th Edition.

Headlight Motot by Kent Schoneman

Preparing my son, Mike's '63 for judging in the Spring. Unfortunately, discovered (among other things) the driver's side headlight would not roll up. We had "restored" the car in late 90's - nice but not to NCRS specs. I kept the car when Mike moved to PA in early 2000's and with much help from my buddy Herb Force we re-restored the car to be more NCRS correct. Mike moved back to KC in 2010 and I gave the car back to him. Life gets in the way and he barely drove it for many years. Was going to send the motor off but after a little research I read a great article by NCRS member Alann Boatright and decided to give it a shot. Here's the approach I took:

Step one, remove the hood – It's possible to R&R to motor with the hood in place but honestly it's worth the effort to take it off especially during reinstall of the motor.



After disassembling the motor the problem was obvious – the grease looked more like Gorilla Glue – seriously!

I literally used a screwdriver, toothpicks and a brass brush with lacquer thinner to clean things up – very tedious!



Finally had everything looking like new





Note in the pic on the right the large gear with the rectangular hole (that plugs into the headlight bucket) I marked a small section on top with a black Sharpie – that is the part of the gear with slightly damaged teeth – positioned it 180* from the worm gear so I'll be using only the good section of teeth.

Greased everything up and reassembled – note I did not take the electrical portion of the motor apart. The motors were previously restored and I was pretty sure the only problem was the hardened grease.



Reinstalled the motor – this is where having the hood off makes thing a little easier – still a real chore. Works great now – ready for ops!



Hope this will encourage you to DIY your motors and save some time and money. Any questions – give me a call.

C3 Seat Hinge Failure and Replacement by Marty Tydings

The driver's side seat on our 1980 C3 decided it no longer wanted to fold down. I did some research on Corvette Forum on how to fix it and did not find a solution. I went back out to the car to see if trying to rattle the hinges would cause whatever was binding the hinge to break loose. It didn't. However I did notice I could get to the screws that fasten the seat hinges in by removing the seat cushions. Before I tackled the project I looked for some replacement hinges and found them at Corvette Central for about \$122 with taxes and shipping. Once I had the hinges on hand I started the project.

To remove the <u>top cushion</u> push the right side of the top part of the cushion towards the middle of the cushion. It should release the top right catch, do the same to the bottom right side. With the right side lose you should be able pull the whole cushion towards you – forcing the release of the left side catches.

C3 Seat Hinge Failure and Replacement by Marty Tydings

The bottom seat cushion has two V shapes in the wire holder that is at the front of the seat. Push on the bottom cushion from the front of the seat toward the rear of the car. It will release the cushion from the square opening in the seat frame.





Now you can access the seat hinges to replace them.



The Phillips head screws were on so tight I had to get my corded drill with a big Phillips head bit to get enough torque to get the screws out. The left hinge fell apart in my hand. The new hinges went in really easy.

Replace the cushions and voila you no longer have a seat that won't fold down.

This all started when I was asked this: Do you have a bracket, **GM** part number 3874765? Since my purchase in 1981, I did have one..., along with a matching "GM part inventory tag" from 1981.


This center upper bracket holds rad support, top support tab on the radiator, and fan shroud, unless L88. The 1963-65 1st design (for 327s) was PN 3797221 had a triangle shape and rounded edges. **The** asked for part was in the parts book as GM's 2^{nd} design of that part.

The part buyer is building a 1967 Corvette as a replica of the L88 option. **Funny thing about this part number.**

My 1981 Parts book says, "second design" for the 1965 327 Corvette; Also says "except 396" and "Flat Edges".

More below about what the parts book says later. My AIM for 1965 indicates a change on 12/30/1964; a change to second design. **See item 31 next page**

There is also just one single discussion of PN 3874765 in the NCRS Tech. Forum. A (2005) forum entry asks basically "Has anyone ever seen the "second design" with "flat edges" on a 1965 327 Corvette? (Nobody said yes.)

My photos above show "327 2ND Design" PN 3874765. In the third photo above, that part appears longer than what's being sold as a repro of the 1967 L88 bracket; Repro of what? Today's vendors say GM 3873748, "65-67 TOP FAN SHROUD BRACKET - 396 and 427 L88". My 1981 parts book agrees... 3873748, not 3874765, was the one for 396 "Big Block" Corvettes.

Why did the guy building the L88 want the 327 "2" Design" part? Is the parts book wrong? Perhaps he has a Bill of Materials (a BOM for L88 Option)?

Even if a longer part, L88s don't have a fan shroud, so a shorter version would fit.

Was the L88 radiator more upright? I think not.

A photo here shows a measurement from the part I sold. The parts book says this was a "1965 second design", **GM 3874765.** Functionally, does it differ from the "396 and L88" part? If they differ, I don't see it.



This photo (below) <u>also shows part of the U shaped metal tab under the front half of the bracket</u>. <u>Below, note the same 2.25"</u> measure on the bottom of the 396 and L88 part repro. This next photo shows the repro of GM **3873748**, "65-67 TOP FAN SHROUD BRACKET - **396 AND 427 L88"**. (It was Paragon 3553 and is now Corvette Central's 242040.)

The two parts look and measure the same...

Below, I'm referencing the 1981 page in my old Corvette Parts Book from GM SPO, group number 1.270. (This is a bit of a repeat of the AIM comment above.)

As you can see (again) the 327 upper bracket design was changed for 1965. <u>A THIRD design, 3880085, is listed for 1966-67 327 small blocks.</u>

Also in 1966-68, for the 427s, LH and RH upper brackets **Were added**. Al**SO** note the additional new PNs after 1968...

Back to my 1965 AIM: Also on 12-30-1964, per UPC 11-13 Sheet A5, the <u>non-air, non-fuel inj.</u> <u>radiator support</u> changed from 3858961 to 3874760.


This is when the upper bracket changed from 1st design # 3797221 (rounded edge) to 2nd design 3874765 (flat edges).

Also on the same date, the C60 (Air cond.) rad support (no X-braces) went from # 3858358 to 3874768. The L84 fuel injection rad support was GM 3858963. In 1965, I think it continued to use the 1st design upper bracket.

Here is another wrinkle:

I can't remember ever seeing a 2nd design small block 1965 model year radiator support and upper bracket. All I have seen with 1965 327s look like the next photo.

See the new (7th) 1965 TIM&JG for the first design with rolled edges. This is 1963-1965 PN, GM 3797221:



Was the second design only used for service?

Have I been leading a life too sheltered?


