

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Chairman's Message

Balance: Who doesn't struggle to keep their priorities in check? I really developed a closeness with Vern on those many trips and it was worth it so task accomplished and not at the expense of family. However, I am now at a point where my 2 and 4 year kids are walking, playing, and learning at an exponential rate. How to keep the balance now at this juncture or will I look back at missing out on time spent with them? This has been prodding me for some time and I just have never given it direct, attentive and focused thought, probably suppressing it.

However, I enjoyed a recent discussion with a long time friend and master of his mechanical domain. Really, and this is no exaggeration, a 'legend in these parts' for what he does in mastering GM engineering and technology by keeping it running and often improving upon it, after a few common failures in the Detroit engineering department. Although a great mechanic, he is an amazing dad. He is supportive, serious yet funny, a great example to his kids and thoughtful to others. His kids, albeit much older than mine, are also just as enterprising, talented and quality as their dad. In our discussion I shared with him my distraction and need for priority reconciliation, and he just said "Why?" I told him my kids had never even sat in a Corvette especially with mandatory child seats not allowed in the front of a car, they cannot ride in a Corvette. Long gone are the days kids were in the middle of the seats or in the back. Thus, if not purposeful, I don't care to teach them these "things" are just to be held onto and simply admired for sheer materialistic reasons. However, in my case I enjoy the constant learning, comparing, researching and fixing Corvettes but I thought such is far too dangerous for little kids to get into. That's where his experience with cars and kids brought me some interesting perspective. He said I needed to be aware of their limitations but never think they are too young to learn about things. Especially safety things.



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Share with the kids all I knew about heavy things, pressure, flammables, acids, thing that roll. Never change out a drill bit without unplugging the drill it first. Never use anything that could throw burrs without having safety glasses. Never get under a car without multiple safety features engaged. He shared with me "they will get hurt, they will break things, they will lose things, but they will also learn great things from you. Teach them while you can. The time you think you have will seem to go by much faster than you can imagine". Great stuff. Teaching kids from day one has been something I have really enjoyed over these recent years. Raising them in a bubble is definitely not good either so this next Chapter with kids all in will be fun and educational. They have a lot to teach me. 2019 has already given and promises more great fun for the NCRS Kansas City Chapter. Our Chapter meetings began with a Fuel Injection School that was second to none at Tim's Pizza. February gave us a great Chassis Judging event and the opportunity to inspect one of the best ever midyear naked chassis. Last year's donation from our tiny little Chapter brought us great respect from organizations many multiples or size. We have several events not yet planned but we can be sure we will be invited to other organization's events as they firm up dates. With the weather getting better by the day, I hope we all have our batteries charged because we are about to hit the road running! Bob Henn from our local NCRS Chapter attended his first Regional Meet in Sharonville OH April 11-13. Bob owns a 2003 50th Anniversary convertible which was one of three 50th Anniversary cars used for test judging for the 2003-2004 Corvette Technical Information Manual & Judging Guide. The manuals will be completed in time for the NCRS Nationals in July 2020. The judging required extra attention from the judges as they were comparing the draft Judging Guide with what they found on the actual cars. Quite a few corrections were noted for inclusion in the 2nd draft of the manual. Alan Tremain, National C5 Judging Chairman, used pictures of Bob's F55 suspension computer and cover pad for inclusion in the next revision to the judging manual.

Since it was Bob's first Regional, John Hecker provided valuable assistance and guidance to walk him through the process and what to expect. At the end of the day,

C2 Chassis Judging School—Tony Stein

On Saturday February 2, 2019, five members of CCKC attended an NCRS Judging School and were treated to the opportunity to view an almost complete 1966 L36 (427ci/390hp) chassis. The five of us are all members of the KC chapter of the National Corvette Restorers Society. The owner (Tony Stein, who spoke to our club several years ago) is a Master Chassis judge with the NCRS. Tony walked us through the complexity and detective work necessary to bring a 53 year old car back to the way it was when it left the St Louis Assembly Plant in April 1966.

For members not familiar with the NCRS, it is an organization dedicated to "the preservation, restoration, and enjoyment of early Corvettes and related material as well as to encourage and publish studies and research pertaining to their history." Additionally, "NCRS Judging is recognized around the world as THE STAND-ARD in determining originality. The Judging System is designed to educate each owner about their car as well as providing recognition for excellence in the areas of restoration, performance, or preservation."

Tony walked us through many of the details necessary to obtain a high score in the chassis section of Top Flight certification. You rarely see a chassis without the body attached, so we were privy to seeing how well engineered and solid these C2 Vettes were.

As an extra treat Mark Gordon of Mark's Paint and Fiberglass trailered the 1966 Corvette Roadster body of the same car, in its prepped but pre-paint condition. Mark's work is so desired in the Corvette restoration community that his next available appointment is in 2020!

To a true Corvette "geek" having a chassis completed to exactly this stage and at this level plus the body at this point in time, is a tremendously rare opportunity.

We all walked away with one thought, "Wow, I want that car!"

It is also our intention to develop a restoration game plan with "Brother Jim" as it is time to complete the 1958.

We hope this story will help us all appreciate what God has given us as we move forward. Let's all be true "Survivors" in every sense of the word. Your prayers and friendships are most appreciated.

Latest info on the New C8 Corvette

When the first official photos of the new C8 Corvette appeared last week, we were so busy studying the overall design that we missed a few interesting additions to the camouflage. But the staff over at "Road and Track" and "Corvette Blogger" pointed out some small stickers of a sil-



houette that depicts not just any man, but THE man when it comes to Corvette.

You have to zoom in close, but we managed to find three. One appears on the side mirror, another on the door, and a final one toward the front just behind the passenger-side headlight. There have been rumors the top-tier, highest-performing C8 could carry "Zora" as the nameplate, living above the ZO6 and ZR1 trims, so this discovery could fan those flames.

"Zora Arkus Duntov" is the man to thank for the Corvette's status as America's most beloved sports car. He joined the Corvette team after the 1953 debut, but once on board, he set the target of making the Ameri-

can car competitive with the European sports cars of the time.

He shoehorned the small-block V-8 in the Vette's fiberglass body shell, but it was more than power that he wanted to change about the car. Duntov felt in order to be competitive, the Vette would need to go mid-engine.

Duntov died in 1996, but not before he put multiple prototypes of the mid-engine Corvette in front of GM executives. Now, with the mid-engine C8 on the horizon, someone at Chevrolet got a little sneaky with a nod to the man who so passionately envisioned the Corvette on its current path.

Sa as big of a shift as the mid-engine design represents, there is a contingent of Corvette faithful that have seen tis coming all along. After all, it's part of the dream of the man who shaped America's sports car into what it is today.

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Latest info on the New C8 Corvette

Well, the C8 Corvette is finally semiofficial. Late last week, General Motors CEO Mary Barra rode shotgun while Corvette chief engineer Tadge Juechter drove slowly through Times Square in a camouflaged C8 Corvette. Emblazoned on the side of the C8 was July 18th, 2019, which is reported to be the official launch date.

The rumors of the C8 being called a "Zora" had fuel added to them, as a C8 photographed in New York wore small Zora Arkus-Duntov Stickers on the mirrors and door handles.

It is also being reported that the C7 front engine Corvette is coming to an end; no C7 and C8 being built/offered at the same time. This means there is no reason to keep racing the C7.R. The good news for Corvette Racing is that a rumored all-new C8-based race car is in the works; there is even video of a C8 at Sebring International Raceway in Florida. If history repeats itself like it usually does, the C8.R will be announced sometime later this year. It is expected that the C7.R's last race will be at the Petit Le Mans this year, with the C8.R arriving at the 2020 Rolex 24.





