MAJOR GENERAL JAMES EVERETTE LIVINGSTON, MOH, USMC (Ret) Biography

Major General James E. Livingston retired on September 1, 1995 following over 33 continuous years on active duty in the United States Marine Corps. His last assignment was the Commander of the Marine Forces Reserve in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in June 1962 following graduation from Auburn University. Early assignments included service as a Platoon Commander, Intelligence Officer, and as a Recruit Training Regiment Series Commander. Promoted to Captain in June 1966, General Livingston served as the Commanding Officer of the Marine detachment aboard the aircraft carrier USS Wasp, before joining the 3rd Marine Division (Reinforced) in the Republic of Vietnam in August 1967.

On May 2, 1968, while serving as the Commanding Officer, Company E, 2d Battalion, 4th Marines, he distinguished himself above and beyond the call of duty in action against enemy forces and received the Congressional Medal of Honor.

After his second tour in Vietnam, General Livingston served as an instructor at the Army's Infantry School, Director of Division Schools for the 1st Marine Division, and, later, as the S-3 for 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines. In March 1975, he returned to Vietnam and served as the Operations Officer for the Vietnam evacuation operations which included Operation "Frequent Wind", the evacuation of Saigon.

He then commanded the Marine Barracks, United Kingdom, London, and served as the Commanding Officer, 3rd Recruit Training Battalion, then as the Assistant Chief of Staff for Operations and Training at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, South Carolina. During this period, he earned a master's degree in Management from Webster University. General Livingston then served with the 2d Marine Division and commanded the 6th Marines before joining the Joint U. S. Assistance Group in the Republic of the Philippines.

Following advancement to Brigadier General on June 10, 1988, he served as Deputy Director for Operations at the National Military Command Center in Washington, D.C. During Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm, General Livingston commanded the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center, 29 Palms, California, and developed the Desert Warfare Training Program. After commanding the Marine Expeditionary Brigade, he was advanced to Major General on July 8, 1991 and assumed command of the 4th Marine Division (Reinforced). In July 1992 he assumed command of the newly created Marine Reserve Force, and continued through its reorganization in October 1994 with its new title, Marine Forces Reserve.



MAJOR GENERAL JAMES EVERETTE LIVINGSTON, MOH, USMC (Ret) Biography, Continued

Major General Livingston is a native of Towns, Georgia. He is a graduate of the Amphibious Warfare School, the Marine Corps Command and Staff College and the Air War College. His decorations include the Medal of Honor; Distinguished Service Medal; Silver Star Medal; Defense Superior Service Medal; Bronze Star Medal, with Combat "V"; Purple Heart, Third Award; Defense Meritorious Service Medal; Meritorious Service Medal, Second Award; Navy Commendation Medal, with Combat "V"; Combat Action ribbon, Second Award; and various other service and foreign decorations. He is also a qualified military parachutist. In 2018 he was awarded South Carolina's highest honor, the Order of the Palmetto, by Gov. Henry McMaster.

Major General Livingston retired from the Marine Corps in 1995. He is Chairman Emeritus and an Honorary Board Member of the National World War II Museum in New Orleans, and Advisory Board Chairman of the Congressional Medal of Honor Museum in Mount Pleasant, SC. He also serves as a founding Board Member of the Beacon Community Bank in Charleston, South Carolina and was recently awarded the Daughters of the American Revolution's highest award for patriotism, leadership, and service, the DAR Medal of Honor. Major General Livingston is married to the former Sara Craft, a graduate of the University of South Carolina. They have two daughters, Kimberly and Melissa. Kimberly, a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy and Medical University of South Carolina is a MOHS Surgeon in a private practice. Melissa is a graduate of Tulane University, New Orleans, and holds a Master in Public Administration degree from Villanova University in Pennsylvania.





DEPUTY ADJUTANT GENERAL JOHN A. SHULER, US Army (Ret) Biography

John A. Shuler is a retired Colonel, having served in the Army and the South Carolina Army National Guard for a total of 41 years. He served as Deputy Adjutant General from 1995 until 2011. He and his wife, Phyllis, now live in Bowman, and he serves on the Board of Trustees of the Regional Medical Center in Orangeburg. Colonel Shuler commanded the 163rd Support Battalion of the 218th Infantry Brigade of the SCANG of which the Bamberg Unit was a part. He has had a long connection to the Bamberg community.

BRIGADIER GENERAL JEFFREY JONES, Deputy Adjutant General Biography

U.S. Army Brig. Gen. Jeffrey (Jeff) Jones serves as the Deputy Adjutant General for the South Carolina Military Department, effective April 17, 2019. Jones enlisted in the South Carolina Army National Guard in 1985 as a 13B, Field Artillery Cannon Crewman, and assigned to Service Battery, 3-178th Field Artillery (FA) in Chesterfield, South Carolina. Jones subsequently attended Palmetto Military Academy (OCS) and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in 1987. Jones is a 1987 graduate of The Citadel and he holds Master's Degrees from the University of South Carolina in Columbia and the U.S. Army War College. Among his military awards include the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star, the Iraq Campaign Medal, and the NATO Medal (KFOR). Jones resides in Mount Pleasant with his wife, Amanda. They have three children: Houston, Lydia, and Isobel.

BRAD SPENCER, SCULPTOR

Brad Spencer was born in Detroit, Michigan in 1958, raised in and around Greensboro for most of his life and currently lives in Reidsville, NC. He earned a BFA in painting '80 and MFA in sculpture '83 from UNC-Greensboro. After serving as a teaching assistant and then a part time instructor at UNCG, Brad began his sculpture career, exhibiting in galleries and in art festivals. In 1989 he began sculpting in brick, an ancient but unusual sculpture medium. While the brick sculpture started with commercial and residential projects, Brad's main focus now is public art. Brad is joined in the studio by his wife, Tammy. "We visit galleries and museums to experience art but public art comes to us and confronts our daily lives. It becomes a shared experience helping to shape a community's image" The veterans in his sculpture "By Land, By Sea. By Air" were inspired by all the military men and women who serve our great nation.

Veterans Day History

President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the first Armistice Day on November 11, 1919, one year after the Allied powers signed a ceasefire agreement in France that ended World War I at 11 a.m. on November 11, 1918. Wilson's words at the First Armistice Day (now called Veterans Day) are as fitting today as they were then.

"To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations."
