Bamberg County earns national achievement award for Bamberg-Barnwell Emergency Medical Center

WASHINGTON – Bamberg County has been recognized with an Achievement Award from the National Association of Counties (NACo). The awards honor innovative, effective county government programs that strengthen services for residents.

NACo recognized Bamberg County with a 2019 Achievement Award in the Health Category for its program titled "A Regional Solution to a Healthcare Desert: A Freestanding Emergency Center." This collaborative project that involved Bamberg, Barnwell, Orangeburg, and Calhoun Counties, the Regional Medical Center of Orangeburg and Calhoun, Southern Carolina Alliance, SC Department of Health and Human Services, and the local legislative delegation including Senators Hutto, Matthews, Bamberg, and Hosey.

"I am proud of this collaborative project between four counties, a municipality, a hospital, the local economic development team, and the state delegation," stated Trent Kinard, Bamberg County Chairman. "To win this national recognition demonstrates the importance of the Bamberg-Barnwell Emergency Medical Center to our communities, and also highlights the necessity of partnerships to address rural healthcare challenges nationwide."
