## A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Saving teaching mixed with healing action. That is what we see throughout Mark's Gospel. Jesus teaches the Truth that saves the human soul, and he heals the human body. He does this in order to help us understand the truth of the Resurrection. As Christians, our faith is based on the belief that in a certain moment after our death, Jesus will join our soul and body together again, and those who have followed Him will live forever in heavenly glory. That is an amazing promise, and in order that we have a way to understand it, Jesus begins his ministry teaching the truth of God and healing the bodies of those around Him.

In the Latin language, the word for bodily health and the word for salvation are the same – "Salus." The same word describes both an earthly reality and a heavenly one, and that is good because they are never actually separated – only in our minds are they separated. Every suffering of the human body is connected to our salvation. We see that truth made manifest in a clear way in our Gospel today. Jesus heals the mother-in-law of Peter from a terrible fever, and then she serves Jesus and His apostles in her home. It is a simple act, but it is a saving one. Who among us does not find our salvation in serving Jesus, even in the most humble way?

The Gospel also provides another masterful detail: It is after sundown that the other people in the town bring out their sick for Jesus to heal their bodies. Remember that the day is the Sabbath, and the Jewish people would have been reluctant to do anything that was considered "work" on the Sabbath, so they wait for sundown when the sabbath is officially over. In approximately three years from this moment, the sunset of the Sabbath day will be the first Easter, when Jesus rises from the dead in heavenly light to accomplish our salvation and the promise of the Resurrection for all believers! Right from the start of His teaching, Jesus is preparing us for the mystery of His Resurrection!

Our call is to be a people who believe and proclaim the Resurrection in the way we live our lives and in the way we embrace suffering for the kingdom. St. Paul teaches this to us with the powerful reminder: "I consider that the sufferings of the present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us." (Romans 8:18) May all our actions be mixed with the healing teaching of Our Lord Jesus Christ!








## Lenten Study
