A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Our Lord Jesus came among us and in His flesh, He gave us an example of a perfect life: poor, chaste, and obedient. This way of life remains an ideal for Christians all over the world, and these three gifts are known across the world as the evangelical counsels. They are teachings of the Gospel that bring happiness and freedom to the Christian and help transform this world into the Kingdom of God.

The poverty of Christ is seen in His emptying of Himself in order to be the perfect image of the Father in the world. The human person tends to want to possess, to control, and to cling to material things as if they can help us achieve immortality. But this desire always ends in frustration and disappointment. Everything that we can perceive in this world with our five senses is either already dead or dying. The only thing that lives forever is the soul. Yet, we still hold out the foolish hope that the passing material things of this world will somehow bring us eternal peace and happiness.

The chastity of Christ provides for us an escape from the domination of the carnal desire and helps the Christian to re-direct the passions within him/her towards God rather towards the satisfaction of the lower appetites. We live in a world ever more polluted with vulgarity and the degradation of the human body, so much so that many people consider a life lived in chastity to be a state of perversion rather than a holy way of life. The Christian, however, must strive with God's help to be free from the slavery of the flesh, in order not to succumb to what is never-satisfied and ever-consuming.

The obedience of Christ is a model of accepting the will of the Father, trusting in Him and His wisdom. So many of our actions are driven by our disordered desires to control things and to manifest our personal will rather than the will of God in this world. When we pray to God in the Lord's Prayer, we pray that "thy will be done." This is a powerful statement, but often we find ourselves betraying our prayer because we are unwilling to accept His will. We can even go so far as to rebel against God when we decide that He has not done something the way we wish it to be.

Every Christian is called to embrace in some fashion these evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity, and obedience. We cannot remain mired in our materialism, lust, and rebellion. The example of the consecrated religious among us is a testimony to the fact that this Christ-like life is possible. Embrace it! Love it! We can live these holy counsels in communion with Our Lord!
