# A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

One of the misconceptions held by most people is that previous ages and generations were not as "sophisticated" as we are today. Actually, it happens that our ancestors were in many ways far more sophisticated than we are today, because they knew how to live more effectively in a society ordered to wisdom and the common good. Often, we are blinded by advances in technology and science, and instead of letting those things serve the beauty of our essential human dignity, we allow them to rob us of real progress in developing the human person to live a communion of love in imitation of Christ.

In these past weeks, we have seen the violence and aftermath of a person, who, as a result of radical individualism, sought to shoot and kill innocent children while they were at prayer in their Catholic school. This atrocity has no real explanation, as the acts of the evil spirit are designed to create chaos and disorder in the midst of the People of God.

Our Lord Jesus, however, gives us a clear way to order our lives to the good as disciples. The Christian disciple is called to order all things in relationship to the wisdom the God reveals, shows, and manifests in this world. The transformation of disorder into order is seen in the image of the Holy Cross with Our Lord crucified upon it. Jesus embraced violence, suffering, humiliation, and degradation in order to transform it through love. This is the mission of the Christian disciple, and no disciple can escape this mission.

The development of the many technologies that we use daily can have positive results, but only if they are used in an ordered way, promoting the human community first and not allowing a person to escape the duties and obligations of the human person to live in a well-ordered society, contributing to the common good. When these terrible acts of violence occur in our society, we often find that the murderous impulse developed within the killer in isolation or in an echo-chamber of their own creating. Had that person been involved in their parish as a servant of God, reaching out to the poor, the outcast, or the lost, the chances are very slim that a person would develop the capacity to murder innocent children. It is a moment for us all to wake up to the dangers of isolation and dedicate ourselves anew to the transformative life of the


