

# A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

In the Latin language, there is an inseparable connection between the concepts of "health of body" and "salvation of soul." One word is often used for both - "salus." That concept refers the wellness of the human person in its three integral dimensions: body, mind, and soul. We see this strong concept throughout the Sacred Scriptures as well. God desires that his beloved children be healthy not just in body, but also in mind and especially in their soul.

One stark reality we face in the Sacred Scriptures is that every person healed by Jesus from a bodily illness eventually died. Even those people that Jesus raised from the dead, Lazarus, and the son of the widow of Nain, all eventually died. We too, face the reality that one day, this body of ours will die, but what can we say of the health of our soul? All of those healed by Jesus had the door opened to them for a healing in the souls that would lead them to eternal life.

The wonderful gift of life we experience is from time to time troubled by illness. Diseases, accidents, weakness, all these things befall the human person. Health, however, has so much more significance than simply the freedom from wounds or illness. The fullness of health comes when we understand how Jesus cures us from all that could kill the soul and wound the body that He has created in Himself.

The Church provides us the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, through which the whole Church prays for the health of one of its members. The Anointing of the Sick, however, is closely linked to the other healing Sacrament, Confession. In fact, our Catholic faith teaches us that we must receive Sacraments faithfully, without mortal sins on our conscience which kill the soul. Without focus on the health of our soul, without the humility to return to Christ with our bodies to thanks Him for His mercy, how can we claim to seek wholeness? The health of the soul is the most fundamental health of the human person, and without the health of the soul, all other health is lost, both of body and mind.

Though everyone that Jesus healed in body and mind eventually died, their souls were healed because of their thankfulness, the "eucharist" they returned to share with Jesus. Our Lord Jesus remains with us to heal and comfort us in His Mystical Body. Let's encourage one another to never leave behind our participation in the life of His Church. That way, we can help one another to encounter the most profound health and true salvation.
