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A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

It was Our Blessed Mother who discovered the problem at Cana – "They have no more wine." John's Gospel tells us that something unfortunate happened at a wedding feast – the host ran out of wine for the guests – a terrible lack of hospitality when celebrating something so important as a marriage. Mary, knowing well the miraculous powers of her only son, goes to Him with this problem. Jesus, understanding deeply the situation of the young couple, and understanding deeply all the complexities of the circumstance, works the first miracle of His ministry to supply for them what was missing. Jesus turns the water into wine so that this young couple, this new family, can have the fullness of happiness and overflowing generosity for others.

In many marriages, in many families, and in many personal lives, we often encounter problems that show us something important is missing. Despair can set in when we convince ourselves that we are abandoned and there is no one who can help us supply what is needed. Faith in Jesus and Mary, and an understanding of how they work together to love us and give us every good gift can change our outlook on the circumstances of our lives, however, and restore us through connection to another wedding banquet – the Eucharist!

Different surveys and polls tell us that one of the major reasons people leave the Church is over the Church's teachings regarding divorce and re-marriage. At the same time, we also see surveys and polls which tell us that in the U.S., the "Baby Boom" generation (those born between 1946-1964) has the highest rates of divorce, and in particular, divorce after long-term marriage. Additionally, research shows us that the following generations simply do not marry as often, but rather live in informal unions in much higher numbers.

Marriage between baptized persons has been raised to the dignity of a Sacrament due to its importance in building a flourishing society and moving that society towards the Kingdom of God. It is a wonderful thing when man and woman decide to form a community of life and focus themselves on doing the will of God with their whole persons. Marriage has three sacred dimensions:

- 1. Unity and indissolubility (Together until death)
- 2. Fidelity of conjugal love (Mutual and lasting faithfulness)
- 3. The openness to fertility (Building the human family)

These three goods are things that all humans can enjoy, but they take on a special significance in the Christian life, as sacramental marriage and family creates a domestic church, a place of refuge and holiness in the midst of our world. Living the grace of this sacrament to its fullest is a gift to the whole community. Our Catholic faith teaches us that healthy and holy marriages are the cornerstone of society. Rather than leaving the Church because it doesn't conform to our human practices, so much better it is to let our Church lead us in holiness and goodness to become more like God.

The March For Life will begin at approximately 10:00 a.m. in front of St. Charles.


The Jacksonville City Square is the destination. The program will include inspirational music and speakers.
