

A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

If we call back our lessons from middle school English class, we might remember a word we learned at that time: the protagonist. The protagonist is the leading character in a story or a drama. The protagonist is usually the character in the story that carries the positive action of the story and brings things to a resolution. Of course, it goes without saying that the protagonist par excellence of the story of salvation is Our Lord Jesus Christ, who is, in fact, the only hero in the history of the world that could actually bring perfect resolution to the drama of our existence.

One problem we face in our Christian journey, however, is that often and sometimes without hardly knowing it, we have made ourselves the protagonists of our lives rather than Our Lord Jesus. It can happen that we feel that we are the one carrying the positive action forward, and when we face challenges, obstacles and even fears, we collapse before the task of discipleship because of our own weakness. This problem is called "protagonism," and it greatly affects our Christian witness, our peace, and is even a great problem in the prevailing society.

Our Lord Jesus is presented to us by the prophet Isaiah as a "suffering servant." At first glance hardly a protagonist. But this suffering servant joins his life completely to God's own life, and in that union finds strength, purpose, and fulfillment of all good desires. Our own protagonism leaves us failingly independent and serves to isolate ourselves from God's divine assistance and prevent us from enjoying the peace and happiness that come from a life lived "through Him, with Him, and in Him" as the chant of the Mass teaches us just before communion.

There is even a moment when St. Peter the Apostle falls into the trap of protagonism. Jesus is teaching His disciples that He must suffer and die, and Peter has a hard time accepting this. Peter wants to run the show and make the drama of salvation unfold in a way that is more comfortable for him. Jesus gives him a stern rebuke and teaches him to join his thought to the mind of God rather than to remain alone in his human worries. Humans love to make themselves protagonists in their own drama, but none of us can bring anything to resolution in our lives or in the lives of others without God's direct assistance. Rely on the Divine assistance, and may it remain always with us!






