A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

There is a productive tension in Christianity: Jesus has already initiated his kingdom, but it is "not yet" fulfilled. What then, remains for it to be fulfilled? The answer is one that is so simple it is almost hard to believe – what remains is our response.

The desire of the Savior is that you and I respond to His invitation to work for the Kingdom of God. This is why the apostles went out into the world to proclaim the "kerygma" - the basic teachings of Christianity: that the Christ was born, suffered, died, and rose again on the third day, and ascended into heaven in order to come again in glory. As the apostles preached this truth in the world, people began to respond, because it presented a new way to understand everything that happens in this world, the proclamation put all human endeavor in the light of eternal life. If we allow it, all of our work can be transformed for the Kingdom.

Sadly, many people have a different view of Christianity, they have a more pharmaceutical view. They wish to live their lives without any change to their will or behaviors, and then they want their relationship to Christianity to be like a pill they can take that will remove their pain and illness. It is just like eating bad food and unhealthy habits that people refuse to give up, and then they go to the doctor for a pill to cure their sickness. Unfortunately, there is no pill in the universe that can save a soul from death, only a change in the will that brings about a change in our lives can save the soul from sickness and death.

John the Apostle gives us a beautiful vision of the kingdom that is to be fulfilled when we allow our will to be conformed to God's will. Jesus promises us something wonderful when we turn towards Him and allow our hearts to be changed. He says: "Behold, I make all things new." The newest thing to add to Christ's gift of love is our response, a response we make anew each day. Each one of us can choose to love in response to Christ's love. We can choose to turn away from hatred and violence. We can come together to work in solidarity and so achieve a common purpose: the realization of the Kingdom of God in this current moment – the only moment we have.

Pope Leo XIV's coat of arms offers a clear reflection of his Augustinian roots and the values he seeks to promote during his pontificate, particularly unity and communion within the Church. The shield is divided diagonally into two sections. The upper half features a blue background with a white lily. The lower half of the shield has a light background and displays an image that recalls the Order of Saint Augustine: a closed book with a heart pierced by an arrow. This is a direct reference to the conversion experience of Saint Augustine himself, who described his personal encounter with God's Word using the phrase: "Vulnerasti cor meum verbo tuo" - "You have pierced my heart with your Word." Pope Leo XIV has also chosen a motto that reflects this Augustinian tradition: In Illo uno unum, which means "In the One, we are one." The phrase is taken from Saint Augustine's Exposition on Psalm 127, where he explains that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one."
