A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Having purpose in life is a source of great joy. It is an existential question many people ask themselves, and sometimes, not finding clear purpose can throw them into crisis. In my discussions with many young people, this theme comes up – the search for purpose. It also comes up in the lives of more mature people when conditions and circumstances of life change due to age or maturity. It is deeply troubling to me that, many of our young people are moving through life without clear purpose, or even worse, with a clear purpose that will lead to no good end.


Jesus, in the Gospels, gives the most beautiful purpose for our lives – to be workers in His vineyard. He uses this analogy because the vineyard workers are the essential workers that get the production of wine started. They tend the vines, harvest the grapes, and even manage the wine press and the storage of the grape juice as it begins the natural process of becoming wine. What they produce becomes a source of joy and blessing for the whole people. No one person can manage all the parts of the process. It requires collaboration and cooperation, dialogue, and communication - rather like bees in the hive. All of that produces not selfish gains but gains which enrich everyone. This is the true purpose of life – to work to transform this fallen world into the Kingdom of God.

Jesus acknowledges however, that few are the people who wish to come labor in the vineyard. The harvest that will bring joy is great, but many have a hard time accepting their part in bringing about that joy. They remain self-centered and focused on individual goods rather than on the good of the whole people. That is why today, we should each pray for an increase in religious vocations, especially among women religious, and for all young people to find purpose in their lives serving God rather than money and fame.

The whole history of the Christian people is supported by those consecrated men and women who work in the vineyard of the Lord. We have all drunk the wine of joy that they have produced whether we recognize it or not. In schools, hospitals, parishes and so many other places, these workers in the vineyard have toiled virtually unseen, but who have produced a harvest in abundance that gives joy to us all!




