A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

In the sacred calendar of the year, we now come into the last four weeks before we begin the Advent season, which means we can begin to think and reflect on our spiritual lives during this past year of grace. There are important questions we should ask ourselves at this time of the year. One important question is: "How have I encountered God over the course of this past year?"

Encounters with God can happen when we put ourselves in His presence. We encounter Him in moments of mental prayer, in moments of crisis, in moments of thanksgiving, when we come to Mass, and also when we make a visit to the church in a special moment to adore His divine presence in the Eucharist. It is important for Christians to reflect on these encounters and become aware of the grace and company the Lord has given us over the past year. When we do so, we often will encounter our own sinfulness, but also the mercy and love that God has shown us, even in our weakness.

The parable of the tax collector and the Pharisee presents us with a moment that contrasts two individuals in the presence of God, looking back over their lives. Jesus teaches clearly that the tax collector, recognizing his sinfulness and weakness, is able to also understand God's love for him in a profound way and move forward in his relationship with God. The Pharisee, who cannot examine his conscience well because he is convinced of his own righteousness, sadly deprives himself of a beautiful encounter with God as well as the gift of God's consolation, and is paralyzed on his spiritual journey.

A life of prayer is characterized by encountering one's own sinfulness and weakness, but then, through understanding our own failures, we can understand more beautifully that God loves us despite all our weakness, and even more beautifully, He gives us gifts of grace that carry us along our path to heaven, the promise of eternal life.


