## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parish Family,

Because God loves us, He teaches us in a way that will lead us to the most perfect happiness possible, despite the struggles and hardships we might face along the way. Our human experiences form an essential part of our journey of faith, but each one of us experiences life uniquely. It is tempting, and indeed the spirit of evil tempts us to make our individual experience the measure of whether something is good or bad. Sometimes we don't see beyond our personal experience and we try to impose our experience on others. For that reason,

those who believe in Jesus Christ are called to follow His teachings in unity and solidarity. When we break away from His teachings in protest, we end up putting ourselves in the role of master rather than servant.

It can also happen that at certain points in our lives, we do not fully understand some of the teachings Our Lord has given us in His Church, and it can even happen that when we do understand the teaching, there may still be something in our hearts or minds that makes us want to resist. This is a normal experience for a good believer. One thing we do know with certainty however, is that the teachings of Our Lord Jesus Christ and His Church have more wisdom collectively than we have individually. For that reason, we are called to keep God's commandments faithfully, and not try to use our human experience as the final measure of what is truly good.

We heard Peter's words in the Gospel last Sunday: "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Jesus does indeed have the words of eternal life and eternal happiness. Over the centuries, so many false teachers and leaders have tried to convince masses of people to turn away from what God has revealed as truth, and instead follow a false imitation of the good. This is how the spirit of evil has always tried to destroy the human person – by proposing an idea that seems good at first glance, but upon examination, contains nothing but selfish evil – a wolf in sheep's clothing.

The gospel tells us that evil things can come out of a human person, and as they come out, they defile. His teachings, however, as we discover them in Scripture and in the Apostolic Tradition, heal, purify, and strengthen us to do every kind of good work in His name. Together, we can all act to follow His teachings with our whole hearts, and doing so, we can transform this fallen world into His kingdom

# **News from the Center of Concern**

Earlier this month the Center received a call from a local company that had 1,000 lbs. of chicken to give away — 10 pallets of 20-50 lb. boxes of chicken! Director Beverly Hill never turns down an opportunity like this one. After filling the Center's freezers, she called other area food pantries and agencies to share the rest. There was soon a line of cars on Noble Street, queuing up for chicken!

Since May 1st, the Center has helped 164 households with a total of 335 members. This includes distribution of food and clothing as well as \$5,969 in emergency rent assistance and \$12,270 in emergency utility assistance. These are examples of the many ways the Center fulfills its mission: "Listen to the cry of the poor and respond to real needs in a Christ-like manner."

RCIA begins Wednesday, September 1st from 6 PM to 7 PM.


