A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,



Our Lord Jesus lived in a world that was in political turmoil. The rotten and corrupt Herodian rulers in Palestine had sold themselves to the Roman Emperor in exchange for power and protection, but they had no desire at all for the health and well being of God's people. The Romans wanted to rule Palestine and take advantage of all the benefits of the Fertile Crescent and make Rome rich at the expense of its provinces. Jesus was born in a world where the great powers were concerned with advancing their own well being, but virtually no one was interested in the common good of the people, or in the

faithful worship of God in Spirit and in Truth. Jesus, however, continues to make Himself present in a world that sadly has the same problems.

John the Baptist shines out as one person who is living a life that points to God and to His Son who has come into the world. Soon, however, he is murdered through the treachery of Salome and the drunken vices of King Herod. We remember that John had been imprisoned by the king for calling attention to his immoral and wrong behavior in marrying his brother's wife.

It is in the midst of all this turmoil and shameful action that Jesus sets out to a deserted place to pray. Immediately, however, He is followed by crowds who are also suffering the effects of a broken society. The Scriptures tell us that Jesus sees them, and "His heart is moved with pity for them." No one is giving the people what they need. They are being taken advantage of, exploited and used. Jesus, though, gives them blessing, healing, and the food they need to eat. These suffering people find true refuge and strength in Jesus.

Jesus continues this work until today. He instructs His disciples to give something themselves so that those who suffer can be filled. This Sunday, our visiting priest, Fr. Ron, will speak about how this ministry continues in a special way through Cross Catholic Outreach. This outreach is a special and noble project, but it is a project that is a daily way of life for our parish. There are still people like John the Baptist who point to the presence of Jesus in the world and make Him known. Each and every day, the little flock of Jesus' disciples who gather at Sacred Heart Church to worship can respond to Jesus' call to give those who hunger and search the things that satisfy body and soul. We will be amazed at the miraculous increase!


