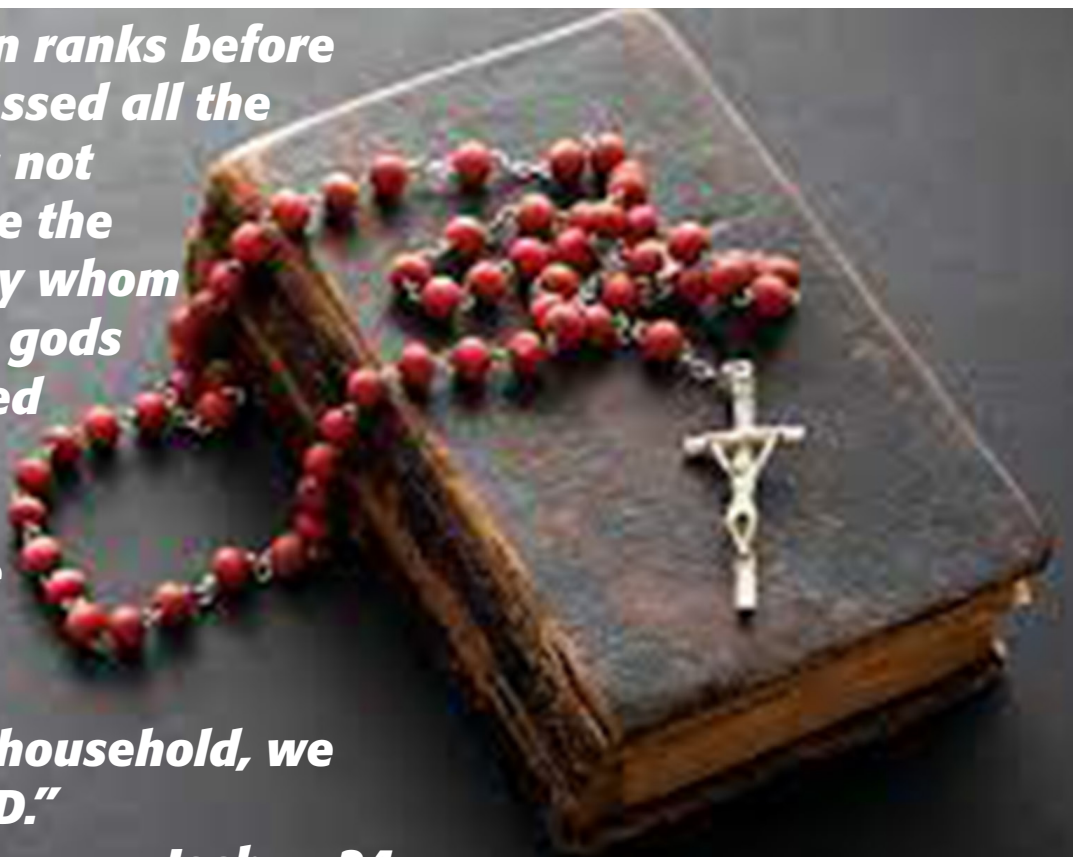

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parish Family,

The Scriptures recall for us the often-repeated phrase of Joshua: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." That is a noble phrase and a noble idea, and it is born out of remembering with devotion what God has done for us, our people, and our neighbors. Joshua gives a stern warning however, that the people should not forget God later and go to worship other gods. Remembering God's goodness is a powerful spiritual practice, but forgetting Him in crisis or in despair or even in our little annoyances can wound us in our soul.

Servants are deeply grateful for having a kind master. That idea is far away from the minds of many of us, because our society treats those who serve as somehow less important, unintelligent, or unenlightened. Anyone who works in a service profession knows well the skills of diffusing conflicts with customers as well as dealing with unreasonable managers and inhuman company policies. Those who serve are often considered like cattle, they can come or go, work or be fired, as there is often another person who can come along and fill the vacancy.

Our God is a kind and good master who calls us to serve Him, but at the same time gives us everything we need to be good and faithful servants. Serving God is hard, demanding, work, but it is the best work one can find. Our master knows us individually, and He wants to train us to be the best we can be, to serve Him with our whole lives, not just a part. Service, however, is more than an idea, it is made manifest in work.

The Christian who wishes to be a servant of God is also called to think and consider the work one needs to do in order to serve God best. The work we perform to serve God is called an **apostolate**. Apostolates are not just for priest, monks, and nuns, they are for all the baptized. Each one of us must prayerfully consider what apostolate God is calling us to do in order to serve Him. Some of our parishioners serve God by serving at the Soup Bowl here in Anniston, others serve on bereavement committees, others serve by maintaining the church and the grounds, others are catechists, sacristans, and lectors, but there are thousands of things one can do to serve God along with your household. Being a servant helps us to recall all the good things God has done for us. Pray and discern to know what it is that God is calling you to do to serve Him, and then do it with faith and obedience as a son or daughter of the Holy Roman Catholic Church, showing the world that being a servant is the best way of imitating Christ!

Parents and Students (Grades 6-12) please join us on

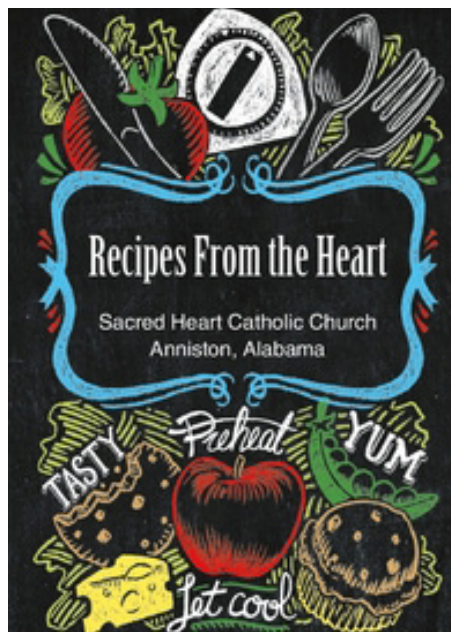
