


ALTAR FLOWERS

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parish Family,

On April 11, 1963, His Holiness Pope John XXIII gave the world a beautiful teaching in his encyclical letter, Pacem in Terris. In English the title is: "Peace on Earth." It was a revolutionary document at the time, in the midst of the Cold War and heightened tensions over worldwide nuclear destruction. It was a significant document in many ways, but also, it was the first papal encyclical that was addressed to "all men and women of good will" rather than simply to the Catholic faithful. In that way, the Pope was addressing his words about peace in the same way

the host of angels announced to the shepherds about the birth of Jesus: "and on earth, peace to people of good will." (Lk. 2, 14)

Pope John spoke about the importance of the essential dignity of the human person and about respect and work for the common good among all nations and peoples. There is one insight, however, that comes later on in the document, which has always struck me deeply. Pope John says: 'There can be no peace between human persons unless there is peace within each one of them, unless each one builds up within himself the order desired by God." If we are to be the "peacemakers" that Jesus calls for in the Beatitudes, we must first begin by building that peace within ourselves as men and women called to worship God and live according to the sacred order He has given us.

I remember a wonderful lesson shared with me by a good Jesuit priest who was my spiritual director. He reminded me not to look to any institution or organization to have a conscience. He pointed out that the conscience resides only in the human person, made in God's image and likeness, and only when those individuals come together, with consciences well-formed and on fire to do the will of God, can we make significant progress in the work of the kingdom. Each one of us has to have in his or her heart the desire for peace in order to become a "peacemaker."

Many of us harbor great conflict in our hearts, and often, we find ourselves fighting an interior battle with ourselves. Sometimes our desires are disordered and harmful, and sometimes we don't feel strong enough to fight for the good, the true, and the beautiful. Sometimes we find violence within our own hearts. It can happen that the lack of peace in our own hearts makes us lash out to condemn or blame the other for our suffering, but Jesus gives us the key that opens every door of goodness – the key of mercy. God loves us and wants us to live in peace. The obstacle is our unwillingness to share His mercy with others, locking doors against them when they seek the treasure of God's love. Let's use the keys given by our Lord to St. Peter to open wide the doors of our hearts to Christ



DECREE EXTENDING THE DISPENSATION FROM THE SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION DUE TO COVID-19

In accordance with canons 87 § 1 and 90 of the *Code of Canon Law*, I make the following provision, recognizing that infection rates for COVID-19 remain generally high in the territory of the Diocese of Birmingham in Alabama and that the dispensation I previously extended on June 24, 2020 shall soon expire, on September 6, 2020:

I hereby extend the dispensation from the obligation to assist at Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation through Sunday, November 22, 2020 (inclusive) – the last Sunday of the liturgical year – for all the Roman Catholic faithful who reside in the Diocese of Birmingham in Alabama

I exhort pastors, parish administrators, school principals, and other leaders of apostolates or ministries to continue exercising vigilance and caution in offering the sacraments and other church activities, following the safety guidelines I previously issued.

Recognizing that restrictions on public activities across different sectors of society have gradually been lifted over the past several months, as well as the need for us to recover a more normal rhythm of life even while taking precautions, I warmly challenge those who have not yet returned to the practice of the sacraments yet have assumed similar risks (such as eating out in restaurants, doing non-essential shopping, going to the beach or on other travel/vacations, visiting more with family and friends, etc.) to begin finding their way back to church also. We need the unique graces that the sacraments offer – now, more than ever.

The moral obligation of keeping the Lord's Day holy remains, even for those who use the dispensation and do not go to Mass. Let us sanctify the Christian Sabbath in our hearts and in our homes. Those who thus far have been unable to fulfill the "Easter Duty" (of confessing all mortal sins in number and kind and receiving Holy Communion worthily at least once a year, during the Lenten or Easter seasons) are urged to do so as soon as reasonably possible.

Act now to help save Catholic schools!
